**Sacrament of Matrimony:** In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

**Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor:** It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at [www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis](http://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis).

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

## PASTOR

"Jesus is the reason for the season." Yes, but who is Jesus? Amazingly, believers as well as those who have not yet come to believe need reminding every year. The birth of Jesus of Nazareth is the birth of the Christ!



During the first several weeks of Advent the readings of Mass recount the prophets' anticipation of the coming of the Christ. From December 17th until December 24th, the Mass readings provide the scriptural/historical evidence of the fulfilment of those prophecies.

Beginning with the genealogy of Matthew's gospel, the Christ's origins are traced back to David the King of Israel, and to Abraham, the father of faith. On December 18th, Matthew's gospel recounts how Joseph was involved in the birth of the Christ beginning in an encounter with the angel who confirmed Mary's child is of God's doing. The gospel narrative in Luke's gospel on December 19th recounts Zachariah's encounter with the angel who tells him his barren wife will conceive John the Baptist; the very one who would fulfill the prophecy of Isaiah as the voice in the desert proclaiming the immediate coming of the Christ. On December 20th, Luke's narrative of the Annunciation gives direct evidence of God's intervention in the coming of the Christ through his human mother, Mary. The gospel of Luke continues on December 21st and December 22nd with the episode of Mary's visitation to her cousin Elizabeth; two women now involved in God's plan to send the Christ meet and confirm one another's special role in the plan of salvation. On December 23rd, Luke's narrative of the birth of John the Baptist, confirms his special role as the private encounter of Zachariah with the angel is made public when his mute tongue speaks the name of "John" to the community. Finally, on December 24th, Zachariah's canticle of praise in the gospel of Luke is proclaimed as further evidence that the God, who struck Zachariah mute for disbelief, has rewarded his faith in the freedom to praise God.

Jesus is the reason for the season because the son of Mary, is the Son of God. As the scriptural evidence suggests, his coming was not a private event. The coming of the Christ heralded by the prophets has come into the world as testified by those who really had some difficulty coming to this conclusion themselves. We should not be discouraged if we feel some lack of faith. That's a moment we ought to trust even more.

"Dios con nosotros: acoger, creer y obedecer"

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Llegamos al umbral del misterio. El Adviento culmina no con ruido ni explicaciones, sino con un signo silencioso: Dios decide habitar nuestra historia. La Palabra de este cuarto domingo nos introduce en el corazón de la fe cristiana: Dios no se queda distante, entra en nuestra fragilidad. En la primera lectura, el profeta Isaías anuncia un signo que supera toda lógica humana: "La virgen concebirá y dará a luz un hijo, y le pondrá por nombre Emmanuel". No es un milagro espectacular para impresionar, sino un signo humilde para quien sabe confiar. Dios no impone su presencia; la ofrece. El Emmanuel no llega para dominar, sino para acompañar, para quedarse, para caminar con su pueblo incluso en medio del miedo y la incertidumbre.

San Pablo, al iniciar la carta a los Romanos, nos recuerda que este Niño no es una idea ni un símbolo: es Jesucristo, Hijo de David según la carne, constituido Hijo de Dios con poder. En Él se unen la historia humana y la iniciativa divina. La fe cristiana no nace del esfuerzo del hombre por llegar a Dios, sino del movimiento de Dios que sale al encuentro del hombre. Por eso, creer no es solo aceptar una doctrina, sino abrirse a una relación que transforma la vida. El Evangelio nos presenta a José, un hombre justo que vive uno de los combates interiores más profundos del Adviento. Ante lo incomprensible, José no reacciona con dureza ni con huida, sino con silencio, discernimiento y obediencia. Cuando acoge la Palabra de Dios, incluso sin entenderlo todo, se convierte en custodio del misterio. José nos enseña que la verdadera fe no elimina las dudas, pero sí decide confiar.

Este cuarto domingo nos invita a revisar cómo estamos esperando al Señor. ¿Desde el control o desde la confianza? ¿Desde el miedo o desde la disponibilidad? Dios sigue buscando corazones capaces de acoger su presencia, no desde la perfección, sino desde la humildad.

A las puertas de la Navidad, la Iglesia nos recuerda que el Emmanuel sigue naciendo allí donde alguien se atreve a decir "sí", donde se protege la vida, donde se obedece a Dios antes que al temor. Dios está con nosotros, no como promesa lejana, sino como presencia viva que pide ser recibida.

Que en estos últimos días del Adviento aprendamos, como José, a creer sin condiciones, a obedecer sin reservas y a acoger sin miedo al Dios que viene a habitar nuestra historia.
