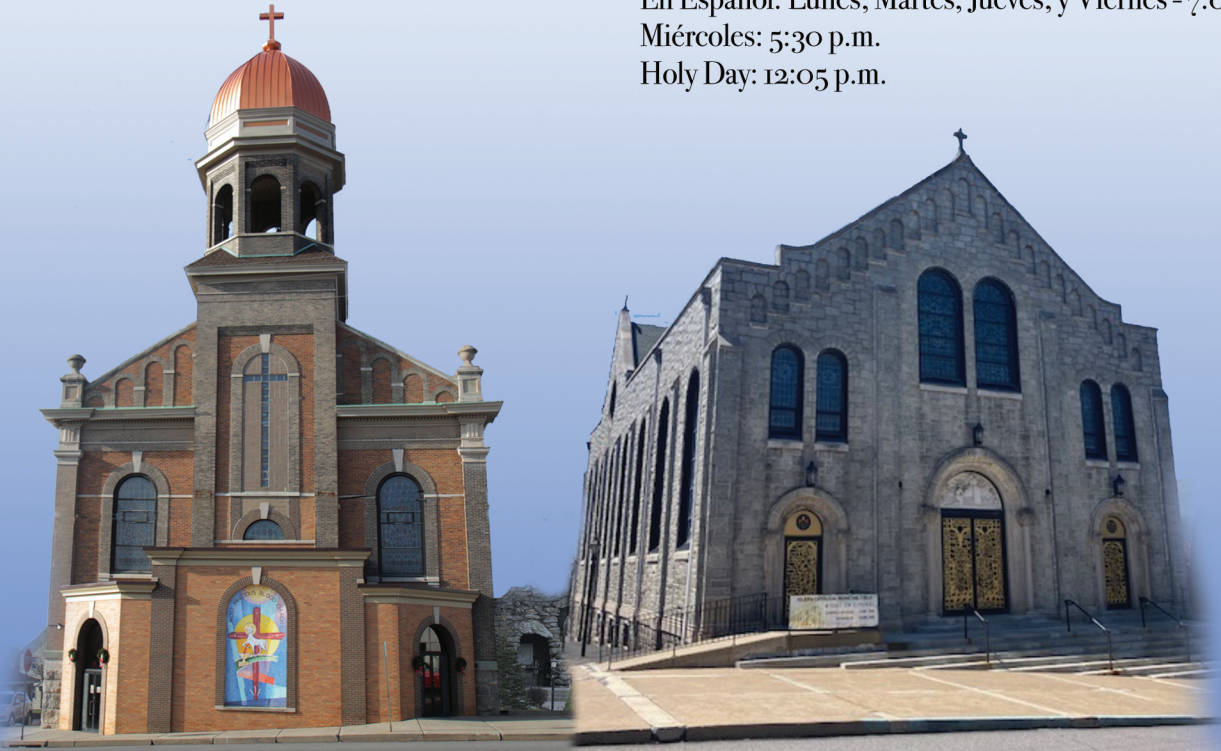

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

“The Lord,” “God,” “The Son of God.” Those words are from the readings for this Sunday which celebrate The Most Holy Trinity. Those words get right to the point concerning an absolute mystery: Three persons in One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Perhaps we can leave complicated explanations about the mystery of the Holy Trinity for brilliant theologians to figure out. But, for you and me, simple references are just as well especially because God is not a matter of dogmatic formulations to be explained away. Today’s readings focus on something more personal in nature. Exodus talks about an intimate relationship existing in the divine and human experience of life. Moses, representing all of humanity, encounters “the Lord.” It was a fearsome experience for Moses. Yet, “the Lord” he encounters is “a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.” Saint Paul tells the Corinthians that “God” is “the God of love and peace.” And the Gospel according to John speaks of God who promises life without end. I can’t help but think that today’s readings introduce us to “God” who is a friend anyone would like to have in his or her own corner. If I could bring it a little closer to home, it’s that kind of friendship that simply is, yet one that defies explanation, when thinking about the friendship between a husband and a wife both of whom also happen to be a father and a mother. Maybe, if that familial friendship is something you know and cherish, then maybe God just got a little closer to you today.

How close is God to you and me? Try something out right now as you read this. Take the pinky of your right hand and curl it into your palm. Then take your remaining three fingers and bring the tips of them together with the tip of your thumb. Now, with your right hand so formed, bless yourself, saying, “In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” Yes, you’ve just blessed yourself as you’ve done hundreds of times before. But this time, maybe for the first time, you used the fingers of your hand to say something as well. The three fingers together represent the three persons of the Blessed Trinity, and the thumb represents their unity in One God. The entirety of the action is purposely to place our entire selves, body, soul and spirit within the sphere of the divine family, The Most Holy Trinity. That’s how close God is to you and me!

Querida familia de Nuestra Señora de la Paz, Estamos concluyendo este mes tan precioso de mayo, un tiempo que el corazón creyente ha dedicado con especial amor a las madres y, de manera muy particular, a la Santísima Virgen María. Al finalizar este mes mariano, elevamos nuestra gratitud a Dios por el don inmenso de tantas madres que, con sacrificio, ternura y perseverancia, han sabido reflejar algo del amor providente de Dios en nuestros hogares. Asimismo, volvemos nuestra mirada a María, Madre Santísima, quien continúa enseñándonos a caminar en la fe, a confiar aun en medio de las pruebas y a permanecer fieles junto a Cristo.

En este domingo vivimos también un momento profundamente significativo para nuestra comunidad: la Primera Comunión de nuestros niños, quienes tienen su primer encuentro sacramental con Jesús, Pan de Vida Eterna. No es solamente una celebración hermosa; es el inicio de un camino espiritual que necesita ser acompañado, protegido y fortalecido. Por eso oramos especialmente por los padres de familia, para que ayuden a sus hijos a crecer en la fe, enseñándoles con el ejemplo el amor a Jesús presente en la Eucaristía, el cariño filial a la Santísima Virgen María y el respeto y amor al Santo Padre, signo visible de unidad en la Iglesia. La fe no puede quedarse solamente en un día de fiesta; necesita convertirse en una experiencia viva, constante y sostenida dentro del hogar.

Y en este contexto providencial, la Iglesia nos reúne para celebrar la gran Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, iluminados por la Palabra de Dios: Éxodo 34,4-6.8-9; 2 Corintios 13,11-13 y San Juan 3,16-18. Las lecturas nos revelan un Dios cercano, lleno de misericordia, paciencia y ternura, que no permanece distante del sufrimiento humano. El Evangelio nos recuerda una verdad que nunca deja de conmovernos: “Tanto amó Dios al mundo, que entregó a su Hijo único”. La Trinidad no es una idea lejana o complicada; es el misterio del amor de Dios que se acerca, acompaña y salva. Es el Padre que ama, el Hijo que se entrega y el Espíritu Santo que fortalece y renueva nuestras vidas. Que esta solemnidad nos ayude a redescubrir que hemos sido creados para vivir en comunión, en amor, en reconciliación y esperanza, aprendiendo de la Trinidad el arte de amar sin egoísmo, de sostenernos mutuamente y de caminar unidos hacia Dios.
