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Dear family of Our Lady of Peace. Blessings to all. The word of the Lord reminds us that we have a treasure in Heaven. Because of this, I invite you not to become attached to anything that is not yours, but to become attached to the will of the one who has called you to be his and who has a treasure for us in heaven. To attain this treasure, I must be conscious and alert, as he tells us: To whom much is given, much will be required, and to whom much is entrusted, much more will be required. I am truly happy to know that God has given me and entrusted me with so much, but it also makes me nervous because He has entrusted me with too much. His word, His sacraments, my brothers and sisters (the children of God). Sometimes we priests are afraid to proclaim the kingdom because of what our communities will say, and because of that, they do not advance in knowledge and conversion. Have you ever wondered what God has entrusted to you? Have you administered it well? If today were the day we had to leave this world, would we truly be possessors of the heavenly treasure?
