Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

The celebration of the Three Kings is a day children long for in many places around the world because it is the traditional day for getting gifts. What should we teach children about the celebration? The names of the magi or the kinds of gifts they brought for the child Jesus? These things are nice to hand on, but I suggest that we teach our children that the day is about the search for Truth. Casper, Balthezar and Melchior and their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh are part of a story which tells of man's search for Truth and God providing the answers. Astrology tells us many things about the Truth since kernels of the Truth can be found in every part of creation. Matthew's gospel tells us that the magi arrived in Jerusalem because a great star had risen in the sky. That event indicated to them that someone great and mighty was born in Israel. The magi were versed in the prophecies of the Old Testament which connected the glory of the Lord to the witnessing of great light.

Herod and all Jerusalem were quite aware of the prophecies as well. They knew that the Truth would become flesh in the Messiah. It's just that they didn't know where to find him. The rest of the story is well known.

The magi go to greet the Lord in Jesus born of Mary. Herod feels threatened and so hatches a plot that would secure his grip on power.

So, the point to teach our children is that we all have an inborn desire to seek out and find the Truth. Faith in God will help us see the light of Christ shining in the darkness of our minds. If we trust in God, he will show us the way to the Truth which does not threaten anyone but sets everyone free.

"Levántate y resplandece, porque ha llegado tu luz" Querida familia parroquial de Nuestra Señora de La Paz, FELIZ AÑO NUEVO.

Con gran alegría los saludamos en esta solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor, una fiesta profundamente misionera que nos recuerda que Cristo no se manifiesta solo para unos pocos, sino para todos los pueblos, culturas y corazones que buscan la verdad. La Epifanía es la celebración de un Dios que sale al encuentro, que se deja encontrar, y que se revela como luz para todas las naciones.

El profeta Isaías nos invita con una voz firme y esperanzadora: "Levántate y resplandece, porque ha llegado tu luz" (Is 60,1). No se trata solo de una luz exterior, sino de una luz que transforma la historia desde dentro. En medio de oscuridades, cansancios y desencantos, Dios irrumpie con su claridad. Jerusalén —figura del pueblo creyente— no genera la luz por sí misma; la recibe. Así también nosotros: no brillamos por nuestros méritos, sino porque el Señor ha decidido habitar en medio de su pueblo.

San Pablo, en la carta a los Efesios, nos revela el corazón del misterio cristiano: todos somos herederos de la promesa en Cristo Jesús (cf. Ef 3,6). La Epifanía derriba muros, lusividades y ensancha el horizonte de la fe. Ya no hay privilegiados ni excluidos: judíos y paganos, cercanos y lejanos, todos somos convocados a la misma gracia. La salvación no es propiedad privada; es don universal.

El Evangelio según san Mateo nos presenta a los Magos, hombres extranjeros, buscadores sinceros, que se ponen en camino guiados por una estrella (cf. Mt 2,1-12). Ellos representan a toda persona que no se conforma con lo superficial y se atreve a buscar más allá. No encuentran a Dios en el poder de Herodes ni en los palacios, sino en la humildad de un Niño. Allí comprenden que Dios se manifiesta desde la pequeñez, no desde la imposición. La Epifanía nos interpela hoy como comunidad parroquial: ¿qué estrellas estamos siguiendo?, ¿qué caminos estamos recorriendo?,

¿Somos luz que orienta o sombras que confunden?

Nuestra parroquia de Nuestra Señora de La Paz está llamada a ser casa abierta, signo visible de la luz de Cristo para todos, especialmente para quienes buscan, dudan, sufren o se sienten lejos. La fe auténtica siempre conduce a la adoración, pero también al compromiso: los Magos regresan a su tierra por otro camino. Quien se encuentra con Cristo no vuelve igual.

Que María, Estrella de la Evangelización y Madre de la Paz, nos acompañe para que, iluminados por Cristo, seamos una comunidad que resplandece con la luz del Evangelio, anunciando con la vida que Dios sigue manifestándose en medio de su pueblo.



