Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

It's Gaudete Sunday 2025. Gaudete means, "Rejoice!" Can you rejoice today? More people than we know cannot. They are good people, but they have regrets from the past. They cannot sleep peacefully; cannot pray without tears and fears; they cannot forgive, especially themselves. They've changed their lives for the good, but rejoicing seems impossible.

Jesus said he was the sort of shepherd who would leave the 99 sheep in safety to find the lost one. And when he found that lost sheep, he said there would be rejoicing because of it. But we all know that there is a great deal of work in restoring the lost sheep back in the fold. It's not just the being lost that many people struggle with. It's all the bad things that got them lost and the bad things that happened when being lost that need healing. The prophetic words of Isaiah, Saint James and the Gospel of Matthew this Sunday help us understand the work of healing that needs tending. John the Baptist was not disbelieving when he asked if Jesus was the one. He just wanted to hear it from Jesus himself. And Jesus reminds John and us that faith will keep us in the game of healing all the ills that attack our humanity. And from faith comes hope that the chore of healing and being healed will bring forth a yield to use the words of Saint James; a time when the glory of God will be revealed in the reversal of all the imperfections in nature as Isaiah prophesied.

So, what can bring about rejoicing in us? Remembering that God's not at fault is a good place to start. Regrets for bad choices of the past and thinking God, Jesus and the Blessed Mother won't forgive us is very much a part of the healing after having been lost. It's clear that we project upon God what we cannot do for ourselves, namely, forgiving ourselves. Another way to begin rejoicing is to forgive others, especially those who have some part to play in the regrets of the past. What does anyone gain in not forgiving others? Is that healthy? Is it profitable? Does it make anyone feel good? I think you know the answer to those questions. This is a season for giving. Give yourself a break by giving someone a break with some contact that has been avoided, perhaps for years, in eye contact, with a word that breaks the years of silence, even an "I'm sorry," if you want to rejoice again.

Querida Familia de Nuestra Señora de La Paz:

El Adviento llega hoy a su punto luminoso: el Domingo de Gaudete, el domingo de la alegría. No se trata de una alegría superficial ni pasajera, sino de la que nace cuando el corazón descubre que Dios ya está actuando, aunque todavía no veamos todo cumplido. La Palabra de este día nos invita a abrir los ojos para reconocer los signos discretos, pero reales, de la salvación que avanza.

El profeta Isaías anuncia un cambio radical: el desierto florece, los débiles recuperan fuerzas, los ojos de los ciegos se abren y los oídos de los sordos escuchan. Son imágenes que describen la llegada de Dios como una vida que rompe la sequedad interior y devuelve esperanza a lo que parecía perdido. Así obra el Señor: donde nosotros vemos un desierto, Él ve un jardín en gestación.

La carta de Santiago nos exhorta a vivir esta espera con paciencia activa, como el campesino que confía en la lluvia temprana y tardía. No es pasividad, sino perseverancia. Quien sabe que Dios viene, evita las quejas estériles, fortalece su corazón y camina con serenidad, incluso cuando la realidad parece contradecir la promesa. La fe madura no se desespera, sino que permanece de pie.

En el Evangelio, Juan el Bautista ahora en prisión envía a preguntar si Jesús es el Mesías. Y Jesús responde mostrando signos: los ciegos ven, los cojos andan, los pobres reciben la buena noticia. La verdadera identidad de Jesús se reconoce en las obras que transforman la vida y levantan al caído. Y a Juan, Jesús lo llama bienaventurado porque no se escandaliza del modo humilde, cercano y compasivo en que Dios se manifiesta.

Este domingo nos invita a examinar nuestra propia mirada. ¿Reconocemos la presencia de Cristo en lo pequeño, en lo que está naciendo, en lo que todavía no está completo? ¿Sabemos esperar sin perder el ánimo? ¿Descubrimos los brotes de vida nueva que Dios ya está haciendo florecer en nuestras familias, en la comunidad, en nuestro propio corazón?

La alegría de Gaudete no ignora los dolores del mundo, pero los ilumina con la certeza de que el Señor está cerca. Su venida transforma el desánimo en fuerza, la impaciencia en esperanza y el deserto en el camino. Que este domingo abra nuestros ojos para ver los signos del Reino y prepare nuestra vida para acoger al que viene, al que ya está obrando silenciosamente en medio de nosotros.


