COMMEMORATING FORTY-FIVE YEARS OF MINISTRY

It is amazing to consider that Truckstop Ministries, Inc. held its first-ever Fellowship Meeting forty-five years ago this March at Transport City Atlanta (later to be the Atlanta TA)! It's just as amazing when you consider how much has changed since that first meeting. For a short while, that was the only location we had, meeting every Sunday at 10am, and Chaplain Joe Hunter was happy. But God wasn't done yet. Before long, we were holding meetings at a second Atlanta location, and then a third just south of the city.

In our 10th Anniversary newsletter (1991), we wrote that "we have opened three new Chapels this year, and Don [Ferrell] is in the process of building our third mobile unit...." On the back of that newsletter, we listed all nine of our locations! As we published our 20th Anniversary newsletter, we had just committed to purchasing 15 trailers and were asking for prayer for finances to turn them into Chapels and for volunteers to staff them. By our 25th Anniversary newsletter, we had 67 Chapels; by our 30th, we had 75 Chapels; and by our 35th we had 84 Chapels!

The only thing you can rely on (in this world) is that things are going to change. But what man may see as a setback, God means it as an opportunity. That first truck stop has since been torn down, but TMI is still going strong. We may have reduced location-wise from a high of 85 Chapels to 59 currently, but our online presence has continued to grow. As of this writing, over 8,000 people follow our Facebook page.

Yes, a lot has changed in the last 45 years, and a lot will change in the next 45 – but what Chaplain Joe said in the very first newsletter hasn't changed at all: "Our number one objective is to get the gospel of Jesus Christ to America's Truckers"!

You are on the front line in this battle against darkness, down in the trenches where it can get messy. So we are asking you to join us and be willing to roll up your sleeves, accept the challenge, and let's face it head on. Together we can defeat darkness by replacing it with the light of Christ as we continue moving forward. Thank you for all you are doing in the ministry and your continued support!

We at TMI have come to the conclusion that there are several factors that play into this — electronic logs (which greatly restrict when and for how long a Driver can stop), the availability of church services online (which does nothing to fill the need for fellowship with other believers), and the general spiritual state of people these days, to name a few.

Like Chaplain Dennis in the last issue, Chaplain Guy decided to tackle yet another element that can hinder attendance — visibility. With permission from management, he has a table set up inside the truck stop that Drivers pass by all day long! Along with New Testaments, tracts, CDs, and our location guides, there is also a sign letting Drivers know about the nightly Bible Study they have in our Chapel outside.

Drivers, how's your New Year going? I pray your journey has been safe so far. Allow me to share this thought with you. We're well into this year now and I'm sure we made New Years resolutions at midnight on the 31st of December, only to have broken them by January 2nd. We resolved to make changes because we have seen or heard of a better way, but the real problem is, we didn't commit to the idea.

An example of this lack of commitment is found in 2nd Peter. It reads, *"For if, after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled in them and overcome, the latter end is worse for them than the beginning. For it would have been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than having known it, to*

turn from the holy commandment delivered to them." (2 Peter 2:20-21)

If you go back to verse 1 of this chapter, you'll see Peter is talking about false prophets and teachers. They heard the Gospel. They saw the changes in the lives of true believers. They heard and saw enough in them to make some resolutions. But they were not committed. Their resolutions were soon abandoned as they turned away and returned to the old nature. As reflected in verse 22, they returned to wallowing in the mire because their resolutions were not sincere. There was no commitment. Because of the fact that they had heard and chose not to commit, their end was worse than their beginning. You see, to know and hear is only part of the whole. James said, *"You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe-and tremble!" (James 2:19)* But demons have no hope.

I have good news for you. Unlike the demons, if you will resolve to make a commitment, your hope is secured. Paul wrote in the book of Romans, *"that if you*

confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For 'whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved'" (Romans 10:9-10, 13) That's called commitment.

Make a commitment, not a resolution. Resolve to commit to Jesus. No more lip service, no more half stepping, and no wallowing in the mire of doubt and self-pity. Take your stand today. After all, today is the first day of the rest of your life.

What a way to start out a new year. Resolve to commit!
