Financial Highlights

This year was financially strong, with a positive cash flow supported by funding from Social Development, successful fundraising initiatives, and various community grants. Operating expenses remained stable overall, though we experienced moderate increases in utilities, rent, and fuel costs. Strategic investments were made to enhance our operations, including IT and network upgrades, as well as the purchase of a new van to improve participant transportation.

We have 4 new employment opportunities for participants: Scholten's Lincoln, Central Valley Learning Association and additional positions added with HeartlandDevelopment.




Volunteer Hours
