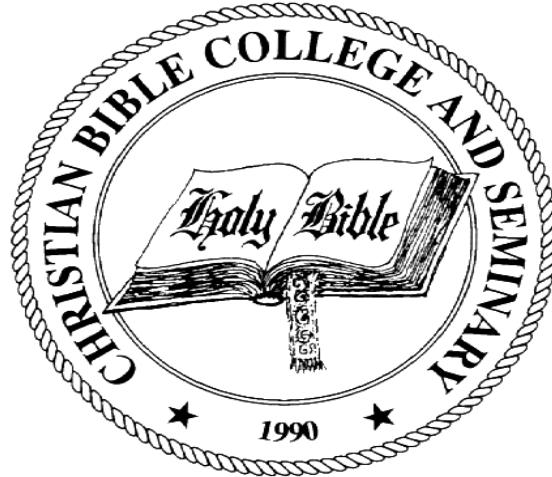

Because the income of those who labor for the Master does not compare favorably with other demanding professions, CBCS tuitions and study materials are consistently reasonable.

Christian Bible College and Seminary has received exempt standing as a religious educational institution in accordance with the Missouri Educational Code Provisions 173.600 through 173.618 RSMo from the Coordinating Board of Higher Education for the State of Missouri. This exemption option is provided to religious schools in Missouri that are not regionally accredited.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Application for admission may be made at any time by residents of the United States. To be admitted, all candidates are required to complete the Applicant Registration/Evaluation Form and mail it with a current resume. Requisite: High School Diploma or GED.

DISCRIMINATION POLICY

The Christian Bible College and Seminary admits students of any race, national or ethnic origin, color, sex, age, handicap, or religious preference in its educational programs, activities, and employment as required by the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Amendments including Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972. The Christian Bible College and Seminary complies with the Privacy Act for Students, Statute 20 United States Code, Section 1232g and regulations adopted and pursuant thereto.

REGISTRATION AND EVALUATION FEES

The Registration/Student Evaluation fee is \$75.00, non-refundable. This total remittance of \$75.00 may be paid by check or money order (payable to: CBCS). Fees **MUST** accompany your application. There will be a service charge of \$30 on all returned checks. There are no additional charges for: matriculation, life credits, diplomas/degrees, transcripts (2), graduation fees, or any other "miscellaneous fees." Extra transcripts may be purchased for \$10.00 each and extra diplomas for \$25.00 each. Tuition prices, policies, course offerings and book prices are subject to change at any time.

TRANSFER CREDITS

The Christian Bible College and Seminary will accept all transfer academic credits you have earned from other Theological schools.* The Faculty Review Board will also evaluate credits from secular schools, and acknowledge career-based life/work/ministry experience. You may have years of part-time work in Christian service which would be of credit value.

*Note: Your transcripts from schools attended should accompany the application, but they may be requested - in writing (Federal Law) - to be mailed to the CBCS Registrar.

EVALUATION FOR LIFE EXPERIENCE CREDITS

Traditional colleges and Accrediting Agencies have established the following guidelines for the maximum credit received for life/work/ministry:

Associate Degree - 50% or 45 credit hours

Bachelor Degree - 25% or 30 credit hours

Master Degree - 10% or 10 credit hours

Doctoral Degree - 60 academic credit hours required, no l/w/m credits

There is no charge for transfer credits to CBCS. Certificates, diplomas, grades, CEU credits and U.S. Military Service are also given consideration. One may have more academic/life experience credits than the minimum required - many applicants do. But no matter the number of l/w/m credits it is the policy of CBCS (and Missouri Educational Statutes) that the student must satisfactorily complete a minimum of one semester (15 credits) to earn the desired degree. The Faculty Review Board will carefully evaluate your application and promptly send a competent, qualified evaluation report. These credits can only be given once upon admission to the school.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Christian Bible College and Seminary offers only Faculty Directed-Independent Home Study (no campus requirements). The policies below apply to all programs: The "open book" method of instruction and test/exams are applied. **All courses are valued at five credits each unless stated differently.** There are no final examinations. Also, there are no core courses with the exception of three Counseling programs: 1. (page 12) Bachelor BC, 2. (page 28) Master in CC, and 3. (page 29) Doctorate in CC.

HOURS AND ASSISTANCE

The staff at Christian Bible College and Seminary is here to help you. Feel free to call us during our regular office hours Monday thru Friday, 9:00am to 4:00pm Central Standard Time. Our office is closed for the major holidays New Year's, Easter, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas break.

TUITION SCHEDULE

There is no Credit Hour/Tuition Schedule (cost per credit). The Tuition Schedule for each degree is the cost of that degree. A 20% discount is available for tuitions paid in full prior to commencing course work. Tuition schedule is subject to change at any time.

Example: An Associate degree requires 60 earned credits before entering the Bachelor's program which, requires 60 credits. Now there is a total of 120 credits, the number needed before going into the graduate degrees. The Master requires 60 credits more (now an acquired 180). The Doctorate requirement is also an additional 60 credits. This total of 240 credit hours is the minimum required by most traditional colleges.

CBCS does not participate in any Government Student Aid/Financing of tuition. There are no promissory notes, no interest, and no demanding schedules. Your academic and financial requirements should keep pace. CBCS example: BA degree cost \$2,200 - \$150 down payment = \$2,050, with 12 courses to complete for academic requirements, divides 12 into the remaining tuition cost of \$2,050 = an approximate \$170.84, payment plus the cost of the book to accompany each course sent in for grading. Using this example will enable you to complete your financial and academic requirements at the same time. All academic and financial requirements must be satisfactorily completed before degrees or Transcripts are issued. All homework should be turned in with the required tuition and book payments.

Please Note: CBCS requires all remittance to be paid by check or money order, made payable to CBCS. You may also pay by credit card. No two-party checks accepted. No books, transcript, diploma, certifications, grade reports, or other student records will be issued unless the students' financial requirements are current. **If you fail to turn in completed coursework for a period of one year, your account will become inactive. A \$100 reinstatement fee and any other past due balances are required to be paid in order to reactivate your account.**

COURSE MATERIALS

The CBCS Faculty Review Board carefully evaluates the contents of seminal works in the field before adopting course material as a part of the curriculum. Approved selections represent the world's greatest Theological authors; they share a Bible-based ancient/contemporary viewpoint of problems facing the Church, the world community, congregations, you and I. The courses cover an extensive selection of the subject material one should expect to find in the traditional College. CBCS students are encouraged to assist in the selection of their course work. Since there are no CBCS "core courses" (with the exception of the counseling degrees) you can choose whatever you feel would enhance your ministry the most. If you have a particular subject or book you want to study for credits, please call for an approval. CBCS textbooks are about the same price as the Christian bookstores. These items are not included in the tuition cost. All materials are mailed/shipped to you rate paid from the CBCS Book Store. Books and study materials are subject to price change (and availability) without prior notice.

COURSE WORK INSTRUCTION

All courses require a textbook - plus your ever-present Bible. Some courses are provided with a Study Guide (designated SG in the Catalog). The Study Guides are compiled of true/false, multiple choice, fill in and matching, no essay or book report is required when the Study Guide is used. Courses which are not provided with a Study Guide require an essay or book report. Each chapter in the text book is a lesson assignment. Write a one to five page essay or summary **per chapter**, (depicting the beginning and ending of each chapter) in your own words, which correctly reflect the author's viewpoint. Your papers should be double-spaced lines whether typed or handwritten. You may use both sides of the paper. DO NOT copy the book (you'll have a perfect paper and a failing grade). Your coursework should be mailed in completed form, not 1 chapter at a time. You will receive a prompt grade report for all complete coursework. Please follow the course work instructions you will receive with your acceptance agreement, and copy the cover sheet that is to accompany any course work when it is mailed in for grading. As you pursue your course of study, you may want to change your pre-selected courses, subject, or the major field of academic concentration. The option is yours and all your earned credits will be honored without penalty.

*Failing students are allowed one more attempt for a higher grade on any lesson assignment. At that time, individual procedures of counseling, assistance, and encouragement are provided. Students that receive a "D" on an assignment may be asked to retake that assignment for a better grade. Note that many institutions do not accept transfer credits with a grade of D or below. CBCS does not offer extra credit in any courses.

TUITION REFUND POLICY

The Student may request a withdrawal (in writing) during the first two weeks after their acceptance/enrollment in CBCS and receive a full refund. After that date, the following refund policy applies: **A.** With-in 30 days from the date of enrollment, 80% refund. **B.** Within 60 days from the date of enrollment, 50% refund. **C.** Within 90 days from the date of enrollment, 30% refund. **D.** After 90 days from the date of enrollment, no refund. The withdrawal date is the date the written notification is received by CBCS. This date will be used in calculating the amount of tuition refunded.

. . . a word about **You Set Your Own Pace**

For the vast majority of our students, the freedom of study in their selection of course work, at the place and time of their own choosing is a blessing. Campus colleges are very expensive compared to home study and most dedicated pastors are reluctant to leave their family, church, employment, and community responsibilities to attend one. At CBCS, we feel that it is important for you to have the option to set your own time frame - within reason - for both academic and financial requirements. Your academic/course work requirements should keep pace with your financial requirements. (See example on page 7 of this catalog.) The updates will keep you informed. **If you fail to turn in completed coursework for a period of one year, your account will become inactive. A \$100 reinstatement fee and any other past due balances are required to be paid in order to reactivate your account.** Through perseverance, sacrifice, and the ministry of the Holy Spirit it all will come together at "point B." 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The Combination Enrollment is a combination of a Master or Doctoral degree in counseling and a Christian Counseling Therapist Certification. The certification can only be obtained at the time you enroll in the Master or Doctoral Program and is not available as a stand alone degree. The CBCS Certification is an added value credential and documentation with your Degree. Together they confirm that you have accomplished all that you can at this phase of your training. The advanced and continuing education schedule includes 60 post-graduate credit hours. When you complete the courses listed as the academic requirements for the specific counseling degrees on pages 29 and 30, and have completed your financial obligation, you will receive your diploma. At that time you may choose to take advantage of the 60 post graduate credit hours entitled to you by enrolling in the combination program at no additional tuition charge except for the books. These courses may be chosen from any book in this catalog for credit. You will receive an 8 X 10 Certificate of completion stating you have completed that specific course of study. Once you complete the 12 additional courses, you will receive your certification. If you know that you are going to pursue the Doctoral degree we suggest that you wait to enroll in the Combination Enrollment until that degree, to enable your course work to continue without interruption after your Master degree. Your training and credentials are for Christian Counseling and will not be acknowledged as a "license" by your State. You may not meet the qualifications as a Chaplain in the Military, hospitals, prisons, or other secular institutions. Before you invest, investigate. Talk with institution administrators, call your State Representative, request copies of Statutes that regulate both state licensure requirements for professional Psychologists and (exempt) requirements for Christian Counseling Therapists in the States where you expect to practice.

OPTIONAL THESES AND DISSERTATIONS

Christian Bible College and Seminary does not require a Master's Thesis or a Doctoral Dissertation as a requisite for your graduate degree. If you want to submit a paper (in place of course work) please carefully read the following information. Detailed instructions will be mailed to you at the appropriate time in your coursework. Do not start this process prior to completing coursework. Dissertations are required for the PhD degree. Program requirements for the Master's Degree and the Doctoral Degree are in addition to the 60 credits of coursework.

Phase one: Research Requirement 30 credit hours. (Semester Equivalent)

Select a Bible-based Theological topic, the books/manuscripts and other research materials and get Faculty Board approval prior to starting the project. Serious thought should be given to the title of your Thesis or Dissertation.

Phase Two: Submit your draft proposal/paper to the Faculty*. It should include the Title, a complete outline and the purpose of your debate. The draft will be reviewed, corrections, changes or suggestions, (if any) will be penciled in, and the paper returned for your perfecting.

Phase Three: The finalized paper (valued at 30 additional credits). Two members of the CBCS Faculty Review Board will evaluate and grade the final paper. Upon successful completion of the Research and the Thesis or Dissertation, you will earn 30 additional credits, required for the completion of your paper. (CBCS will retain one copy for the library.)

*The Dissertation or Thesis should be written in accordance with the book: A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses and Dissertations by Kate L. Turabian. Your final paper should be as near to perfection as possible. Published books may not be submitted in place of a Thesis or Dissertation.

*A Dissertation or Thesis may be submitted in place of course work for non-counseling degrees only. A Dissertation is required in addition to coursework for the PhD degrees.

Thesis and dissertations will be sent for grading 1 time. This cost is included in your tuition. Papers requiring additional grading will be charged \$350.00 for each additional grading.

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
