Pavilion will be closed to general public whilst judging in progress.  
**PRIZES:** First \$2  
**RIBBON:** CHAMPION Ribbon for Section O at judge's discretion. Trophy donated by Ladies Auxiliary. MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR IN CLASSES - 12 to 28 from the Ladies Auxiliary.

### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- Most fruit & vegetables are best picked on the same day that they will be judged, due to wilting and that they haven't reached their full maturity
- Others such as onions & pumpkins can be picked early and entered from Wednesday before show
- **Remember uniform size, shape & colour**
- Exhibits must be grown by exhibitor
- Exhibits to place on **white** plates or white cardboard plates, unless otherwise instructed
- At least one egg will be broken – Eggs to be presented in ½ Dozen egg carton
- Bunches or collections of herbs to be displayed in clear containers of water that is an appropriate size for the exhibit & named
- All exhibits MUST have an entry ticket attached otherwise the exhibits will be classed out
- All care taken but no responsibility accepted by PA&H Association
- Prize money to be collected from Secretary's Office during the show.
