ESSENTIAL BASIC SERVICES – For a Clean, Efficient, and Safe Saint-Bruno

- **Snow removal**: Maintain a high standard of snow removal service and consistently seek opportunities for improvement.
- **Road conditions**: Continue the intensive repair of our streets, sidewalks, and bike paths.
- Collections:
 - o Maintain the current collection frequency; no reduction will be considered.
 - o Simplify branch collection.
 - Review our contracts to allow for emergency collections (e.g., branches after a storm).
- **Power outages**: Continue to urge Hydro-Québec to enhance grid maintenance to reduce the frequency of power outages.
- **Flooding**: Improve the resilience of our infrastructure to minimize the risk of flooding in our area
- **Police**: Continue our efforts to secure better police presence from the Longueuil agglomeration.
- **Smart city**: Explore how artificial intelligence can help us enhance the services we offer to citizens all while maintaining the highest standards of quality.

SENIORS – For a Saint-Bruno That Cares and Stands Together

- Provide free public transit for residents aged sixty-five and over during off-peak hours (RTL).
- Continue supporting the development of intergenerational housing.
- Ensure that all park revitalizations include intergenerational activities and equipment.
- Implement projects that foster mutual support between generations and assist natural caregivers.
- Increase the number of benches throughout the city, especially along main thoroughfares.
- Install more relaxation furniture in public spaces such as swings and picnic tables.
- Reduce social isolation among seniors by offering more events and activities designed for them
- Identify solutions to assist seniors who receive the Federal Guaranteed Income Supplement.

FAMILIES – For a Saint-Bruno That Evolves with Its Children

- Promote configuration and measures to calm traffic and reduce speeding to make residential neighborhoods safer.
- Implement the school mobility plan to ensure safe travel near schools and support active transportation initiatives.
- Support the establishment of new Early Childhood Centers (CPE) or subsidized daycare centers, and plan for accessible land for these facilities.
- Support new elementary school projects in Saint-Bruno and actively collaborate in their development.
- Continue revitalizing neighborhood parks and plan for year-round use including chalet renovations, splash pad installations, modernized playgrounds, new sports facilities, and a variety of activities for all ages.
- Maintain high-quality events, entertainment, and activities for families.
- Provide adapted services and equipment for children with special needs and support their families.

SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURE – For a Fit and Healthy Saint-Bruno

- Complete the construction of the multisport complex.
- Continue upgrading sports facilities, (including soccer, baseball, basketball, tennis, pickleball, hockey, and more).
- Revitalize Rabastalière Park, transforming it into a sports and relaxation hub in the heart of our village.
- Study the feasibility of building indoor soccer fields.
- Continue advocating for the transformation of the former Mont-Saint-Bruno shooting range into an outdoor and recreational tourism destination, developed in an environmentally responsible way.
- Create a disc golf course in Marie-Victorin Park.

ARTS, CULTURE, HERITAGE, AND COMMUNITY LIFE – For a Vibrant, Creative, and Proud Saint-Bruno

- Take advantage of the fire station relocation to create a new cultural hub adjacent to city hall, which will include a new library.
- Display the collection of entomologist Georges Brossard, acquired by the city, as a permanent and educational exhibit in the new library.
- Expand access to community spaces for our citizens and organizations.
- Utilize recently acquired land at Lakeview and Montarville to enhance activities at Lac du Village.
- Consult the public to determine a beneficial community use for the city-acquired land on Chemin de la Rabastalière Est (91 and 93).
- Continue implementing the Arts, Culture, and Heritage Action Plan.
- Strengthen our regulations to safeguard our heritage and launch a financial assistance program for the renovation of heritage homes.
- Continue providing financial support to our community organizations.

DOWNTOWN AND URBAN PLANNING – For a Dynamic Saint-Bruno with a Unique Living Environment

- Expand Place du Village by completing the acquisition of adjacent land to create a vibrant, multi-purpose space for events, performances, public markets, and more. Then, connect this enhanced Place du Village to the new library to foster a dynamic and inclusive community hub.
- Maintain regulations that protect the unique character of our village core and preserve a human-scale downtown.
- Revise the Urban Plan to better guide development, preserve the town's unique charm, and protect the exceptional quality of life that defines Saint-Bruno
- Continue the Christmas festivities and the giant tree-lighting ceremony.
- Promote local shopping and allow for more terraces at local businesses.
- Improve the permit application process.

FINANCES AND PROPERTY TAXES – For a Responsible and Financially Healthy Saint-Bruno

- Maintain a reasonable tax level that respects residents' ability to pay.
- Review each municipal department to optimize resources and improve process efficiency.
- Continue advocating for reforms within the Longueuil agglomeration to establish a fairer cost-sharing model.
- Favor negotiation over confrontation to achieve the best possible outcomes for Saint-Bruno citizens at the Longueuil agglomeration level.
- Continue participating in the provincial financial assistance program for homes with foundation damage.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT – For a Green and Resilient Saint-Bruno

- Protect our woodlands and green spaces by leveraging available grant programs to support cost-effective land acquisitions when needed.
- Continue conducting the action plan to preserve Lac du Village and Lac du Ruisseau.
- Implement the City's Climate Plan, which includes several measures to combat climate change.
- Develop a greening and reforestation plan and explore the creation of micro-forests.
- Increase the number of electric vehicle (EV) charging stations throughout the city.
- Expand the urban agriculture policy and support the establishment of community gardens.

ACTIVE MOBILITY AND TRANSPORTATION – For an Active and Accessible Saint-Bruno

- Implement the City's Sustainable Mobility Plan to strengthen our efforts in improving personal mobility and enhancing public safety.
- Complete Phase 2 of the bike path along Montee Sabourin and continue developing the city's cycling network.
- Collaborate with RTL to introduce a new direct bus line connecting Saint-Bruno to Cégep Édouard-Montpetit and Pierre-Boucher Hospital.
- Partner with RTL, Exo, and surrounding cities to enhance intercity transit connections and introduce an on-demand transit zone.
- Enhance public transit service and scheduling, maintain a connection to the REM, and install bike racks at major bus stops.

HEALTH AND LIVING ENVIRONMENT - For a Saint-Bruno Where Life Is Good

- Negotiate with SÉPAQ to restore free entry for residents to Mont-Saint-Bruno.
- Revitalize the dog park by adding furniture and play structures to make it more user-friendly.
- Advocate for residents' interests regarding the development of the Montréal Metropolitan Airport (formerly Saint-Hubert Airport) and continue efforts to reduce nuisances such as banning night flights, routing flights away from residential areas, implementing measures to reduce traffic congestion.
- Study the feasibility of creating a new dog park in the neighborhood south of Route 116 that will not disturb nearby residents.
- Continue our beautification initiatives and uphold our commitments to the "Fleurons du Québec" and "Ma ville en couleurs" contest.
- Maintain the public market and Christmas festivities.
- Increase the supply of social and affordable housing.
- Advocate for the establishment of public medical clinic projects.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AND GOVERNANCE – For a Saint-Bruno That Listens to Its People

- Continue public consultations to ensure residents can express their opinion on significant projects and hold referendums when required.
- Maintain a straightforward, transparent, and effective consultation process.
- Continue the publication of an annual report detailing accomplishments to promote transparency and update the community on major projects.
- Maintain the Council BBQ events in each district to meet with citizens and listen to their concerns.
