Reflection Points

- How can I avoid self-righteousness in relating with fellow sinners?
- How can we replace the culture of vengeance with that of compassion?

Today's Gospel reading directly follows last week's Gospel in which Jesus taught the disciples how to handle disputes and conflict within the Christian community. In today's reading Peter asks Jesus how many times one ought to extend forgiveness to another. Peter proposes a reasonable number of times, perhaps seven. Jesus replies by extending Peter's proposal by an enormous amount; not just seven times should one forgive, but 77 times. The parable of the unforgiving servant is Jesus' elaboration of his initial reply to Peter. Through the parable we come to understand the depths of God's mercy toward us and the results of our acceptance of God's forgiveness. The king in the parable decides to settle accounts with his servants. We are told that one servant in particular owes the king an enormous sum of money. Despite the promise of the servant, it is unlikely that he would ever be able to repay the debt that he owes. The king is moved by the humility of the pleading servant and mercifully forgives the debt. Rather than displaying gratitude for this forgiveness, the servant confronts a fellow servant who owes him a small debt—a pittance when compared with the amount that was owed to the king. The unmerciful servant refuses the pleas of his fellow servant and sends the servant to prison.

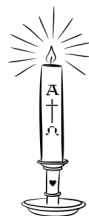

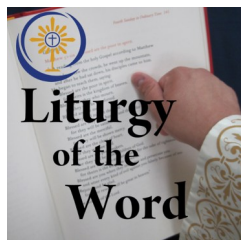

Leo PP XIV

Pope Leo XIV released the "Pray with the Pope" video accompanying his prayer intention for the month of September 2026, which was "For the care of water."

In the video produced by the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, the Pope prays that water may be a "source of fruitfulness, freshness, and hope," and recognizes that water is "a right without borders."

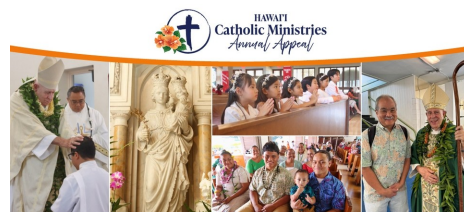
Water, he says, "quenches thirst, nourishes the earth, and heals wounds," as well as serving for Christians as a symbol of God's grace and love for us and our renewal in Baptism.

"Forgive us for turning it into a commodity, forgetting that it is a universal gift, a right without borders, meant for all your children," he prays. "We see with pain so many brothers and sisters who lack clean water, who walk for miles to find it, who become ill due to its scarcity."

Pope Leo goes on to pray that the Holy Spirit may make Christians "pilgrims of the essential," who are able to live simply and avoid all waste or pollution.

He encourages us to defend everyone's right to water, so that all may drink "without fear and without inequality." "May our care for water be a sign of love for the Creator and a commitment to the lives of the poor, educating new generations to value and protect the Earth's resources," he concludes.

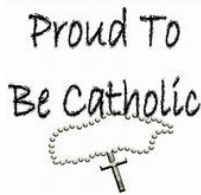
