



Show History

ESTABLISHED 1835

The show was established in 1835 to bring the rural community together and promote best practices in livestock, dairy and crop production. The event has stayed true to its origins but classes have evolved from just Cattle, Sheep and Horses. Biscuit Baking and Homemade Butter were first recorded in the schedule in 1894 and the dog section arrived in 1923.

For generations of local farming families it has been a day to come together with family and friends, show off their animals and produce to the wider community, and put on their finery... as well as have some friendly competition with neighbouring farms!



From 1835 until 1952 the show was held in different venues including Planetreeyetts, Port Glasgow and Lawpark. As the popularity of agricultural shows grew throughout the Victorian period, trade stands, stalls and ice cream vendors were added. In 1897 the first pipe band was booked for entertainment and in 1933 an Industrial Section was introduced including Baking, Eggs and Embroidery. In 1953 the show settled at the Knapps where it has been held ever since. It was around this time that the combustion engine replaced Clydesdale horses which dwindled almost to extinction in favour of new machinery and tractors. Clydesdale horses are

now kept as pleasure horses and are a favourite with spectators. We are lucky to have a great array of vintage tractors displayed at the show each year.

In 2020 and 2021 the show faced a new challenge having only previously been cancelled by war and Foot and Mouth disease - Covid forced the Show off the field so it entered into the realms of cyberspace. The virtual shows were a great success with exhibitors enthusiastically filming and photographing everything from Handy Pony challenges to the muckiest dog competition.



In 2022 we were back on the showfield and raring to go with the sun shining. The show enjoyed its largest ever turnout, and this popularity, and good weather continued in the following years. This year, we look forward to enjoying many of the same classes and entertainment of the generations before us and hopefully the great weather of the past few years.

In order that these measures can be effective, everybody should take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and should obey the instructions of the Directors, Stewards and Officials.

Rules applicable to all visitors/entrants

1. The most up-to-date rules are on our website and supersede those in printed materials. Extraordinary decisions, changes and exceptions to the rules are at the discretion of the Judges and Directors and can be made at any time.
2. The Society/Directors/landowners will not be responsible for any loss or damage by accident or otherwise in the showground or approach thereto. It is a condition of entry to the showground that each visitor/entrant agrees to indemnify the promoters against any legal action from any such incident. Exhibitors' equipment and effects are at owner's risk. All vehicles must be parked as directed by Stewards. Towing within showground is at owner's risk. All exhibits are shown at own risk.
3. Unacceptable behaviours outwith/within rings: ill-treatment an animal; irresponsible or dangerous behaviour/handling/riding; inappropriate/over-use of a whip; any behaviour which is not in accordance with the Rules or general etiquette.
4. All animals must be kept under proper control. If in the opinion of a Show Official, an animal is a danger, the owner/handler will be asked to remove it from the showfield and must do so immediately. No galloping/cantering on the showground except in rings/on courses. Animals must not be left unattended while tied up.
5. Any complaints about the behaviour of a entrant/visitor should be made to the Judge/Secretary/Convener immediately; the entrant's name/entry number must be known in order to investigate the complaint.

Rules applicable to all classes

1. Trophies remain the property of the Society and must be returned in good condition by the 16th April the following year. Trophies/prizes/rosettes are donated by the Society unless stated otherwise and must be collected and signed for within 1 month of the Show.
2. The Directors reserve the right to substitute Judges and cancel/merge/split classes. Judges' decisions are final.
3. The Directors reserve the right to refuse entries. Fees will not be refunded unless the request is received at least 72 hours before show date. In the event of the show being cancelled, no refunds will be given.
3. All entrants should have their own insurance, including third party and personal accident cover.
4. All animals must be healthy, sound and in a satisfactory condition. Doctoring, blistering, bottling bulls or tampering of stock strictly prohibited.
5. Age restrictions for riders/animals are as at date of show unless stated otherwise.
6. Protests/objections must be made to the Judge/Steward in the ring immediately and lodged in writing with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the class accompanied by a deposit of £20. The deposit will be forfeited if the objection is not upheld. All questions of dispute will be referred to the Stewards or if necessary to the appropriate Directors whose decision will be final.
7. A parade of all prize cattle and Clydesdale horses will be held at conclusion of judging and no stock may leave field before that time unless by permission of the Directors.

Clydesdale Horse Rules

1. Entries must be lodged with fees by 9.30am on showday at the Secretary's Tent (except C7).
2. All owners should adhere to the Equine Animal (Identification) (Scotland) Regulations 2019.
3. All ridden horses and ponies must be 4 years and over. No foals permitted under 3 weeks of age.
4. Mounted riders must wear protective head gear which conforms to current standards (see bhs.org.uk), fits correctly, be correctly fastened, and be solid and unbroken.
5. Broodmares; no mares to be shown unless in foal or with foal in foot, or has had a foal this season, arrived at full period of gestation.

Cattle & Sheep Rules

1. Entries must be lodged with fees by 9.30am on showday at the Secretary's Tent (except C7).
2. Entrants must be able to satisfy the Judges and Directors of their exhibit's age (reckoned from 1st January).
3. Exhibits must have been bona fide in exhibitor's possession from 1st May in the current year.
4. Bulls, except one year olds, must be secured by a ring with rope attached.
5. Cattle passports must be brought with exhibitors to the show and must be presented to the secretary on arrival. The show organisers will only notify BCMS of the show movement (i.e. on and off the show field.) It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to record movements off and back onto their holdings.
6. All cattle to conform to regulations approved by any Brucellosis or Tuberculosis schemes.
7. All cattle shown must be from a BVD negative herd/individually blood tested negative for BVD. Documentation proving this must be shown before unloading. Stewards are empowered to refer to ear numbers to check on the ScotEID database.
8. Sheep must be individually identified in accordance with current legislation. It is the responsibility of the keeper to record the correct ID numbers and details in the movement book and passed on to the relevant authorities.
9. All MAEDI-VISNA /CAE stock must be accompanied by a current and valid health status certificate to be shown to Steward before the stock is unloaded.
10. The Transport of Animals (Cleansing Disinfection) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 applies to vehicles transporting animals to and from the show. The show organisers must be informed of haulier's details.
11. The contact info of stock handlers for exhibitors must be recorded and retained for 3 months from show date.

Light Horse Rules

1. Entry must be submitted as per details on page 59.
2. Owners should adhere to the Equine Animal (Identification) (Scotland) Regulations 2019.
3. Ridden horses and ponies must be 4 years and over. No foals permitted under 3 weeks of age.
4. Riders must wear their numbers at all times.
5. Body Protectors must be worn for Cross Country and are recommended for all other classes.
6. Mounted riders must wear protective head gear which conforms to current standards (see bhs.org.uk), fits/is fastened correctly, and is solid and unbroken.
7. Animals competing in classes with height restrictions may be measured in their shoes at at any time by the Society's Vet and their decision, with that of the Judge, shall be final. During the time of measuring, animals must be under the control of Show officials.

Cross Country Rules & Procedures

1. If eliminated, entrants must immediately exit course.
2. No fixed peak hats. Body protectors must be worn.
3. Number must be visible - tie up hair if necessary.
4. No combination may compete in more than one Cross Country class. Riders/Animals in multiple classes will be allocated a class order.
5. Start times are not allocated, when ready to compete, riders should give their number to the cross country tent before 1.30 and wait to be called.
6. No horse/pony allowed on the course unless competing.
7. Only the entrant plus one person may walk the course once the classes have started - number must be shown to gain entry.
8. XC classes will be run under optimum time conditions.

Dogs Rules

1. Entries must be submitted as per details on page 85.
2. The show is open to all dogs aged 6 months and over.
3. All dogs must be kept on a lead and under control at all times.
4. Only undocked dogs and legally docked dogs may be entered.
5. Dogs must be healthy and fit to take part. Any dog showing signs of illness may be asked not to compete.
6. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs.
7. The judge's decision is final.
8. This is a fun companion show, and classes will be judged on personality, overall impression, and enjoyment as well as appearance.
9. Most importantly - please keep it fun, friendly and inclusive for everyone taking part!

Homecraft Rules

1. Entries and fees must be lodged by Friday 8th May at Blackwood the Butchers, Kilmacolm or online at kilmacolm-and-port-glasgow-agricultural-society-ltd.sumupstore.com
2. Exhibits must be delivered to the Tent between 8.30 and 10am. Exhibits not accepted after 10am.
3. A sealed envelope must be secured to each entry with name and address inside and class number on outside. Children's class entries must have child's age on outside.
4. Tent will close between 3.45 and 4pm. Exhibits must be removed between 4 and 4.30pm.
5. Prize money must be collected from the Homecraft Tent on Showday between 1.15 and 3.45pm.
6. Any number of entries will be accepted and placed but only one entry will qualify for points in each class. To qualify for adult trophies, entrants must gain awards in two or more classes. Championship trophies are awarded to the exhibitor gaining most points in a section, in the event of a tie, the judge will choose a winner.
