


Congratulations to Our New CSR Completers!



OCN GOOD RELATIONS



Our Let's Talk PEACEPLUS project has been working with our member group, St Columbs Park house over the past 12 weeks. Young people as part of their wellbeing unit have been completed journaling and vision boards, preparing them for a positive future. They have just completed their OCN in Good Relations and are currently working on planning a teambuilding day.









ENDING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN & GIRLS

Youth Club Keady, on the Ending Violence Against Women & Girls Project. The young women and young men each crafted their own manifestos to raise awareness in the local community about how they can contribute to addressing EVAWG. They hosted a celebration event to officially launch their manifestos, with gratitude extended to local MLA, Armagh Banbridge & Craigavon Borough Council councillors and staff, EA Youth Service, the EVAWG Team from the Executive Office, and the dedicated staff and volunteers from the youth club.

Daire Finn addressed the audience at the event and remarked; "What I realized during my time on the project is that this issue is prevalent everywhere. It's young men like us who need to step up to ensure that the young women who use the club feel safe in our community, just as we do."

Brídín Loughran also shared her insights from working on EVAWG with the young men. "The young men were truly surprised to learn how unsafe we felt in various locations around town. Their experiences in public spaces were vastly different from ours, and I believe this realization has positively influenced their perspective for the future."











ST. PATRICKS YOUTH CLUB

KEADY YOUNG MEN WOULD LIKE TO END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN & GIRLS BY SHOWING RESPECT:



Every action has a consequence. Young men need to explore with young women how some of their actions negatively impact on the lives of women.



Young women need safe spaces to feel free from violence. This can be implemented across society.



Young women are treated differently. Young men are allies with addressing this in our community.

Precautions

More programmes need to be developed and delivered with both young men & women on violence prevention.



Some young men see young women as objects. We need to change young men's behaviours so they can see young women positively.

Consent

This needs to be valued by both young women & men.



Violence against women & girls can happen at any time but young women feel particularly unsafe at night.
There needs to be better street lighting & security so that young women can feel safe while walking alone.









ST. PATRICKS YOUTH CLUB

KEADY YOUNG WOMEN WOULD LIKE TO END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN & GIRLS BY:

Ensuring that our social spaces like the Youth Club are a safe & welcoming place for young women to go to.

Running campaigns & educational programmes highlighting how some young men's behaviours can make young women feel uncomfortable.

Ensuring free health care & sanitary products are available in all public buildings used by young women.

Making sure that conversations by all men towards women in environments such as schools, work, sports & social spaces are respectful.

Promoting awareness of the support available for all women who have experienced any form of abuse.

Ensuring that anyone in Keady engaging with young people have the skills to:

- Make young women feel comfortable to confide in them
 & confident that they are safe.
- Educate young men to become allies to ending violence against women & girls.

Teambuilding Day Hosted by Community Sports Network





BELFAST CITY COUNCIL'S NEW COMMUNITY SUPPORT PLAN LARGE GRANT

Community and voluntary groups can apply for funding up to a maximum £60,000 to support the delivery of programme activities under BCC's Community Support Plan Large Grants. Funding can cover Core running costs of community facilities, Programming and Staff Costs relating to the programme.

Now open for applications until 12 noon on 6 October 2025. Funding will last for three years; applications will not open again until summer 2028. They are hosting information sessions for interested applicants. Find out more on the link above.





HALIFAX FOUNDATION FOR NORTHERN IRELAND: THRIVE PROGRAMME

THRIVE – a new grants programme celebrates the Foundation's 40th year and is made possible thanks to additional funding from their sole funder Lloyds Bank.

THRIVE aims to support charities in providing financial advice, building financial resilience, delivering financial education, or encouraging good financial health among people in greatest need.

Registered charities can apply for grants of up to £15,000 over 2 years. Opens for applications on 1st September 2025 and closes at 12 noon on 26th September 2025.





HENRY SMITH FOUNDATION LAUNCHES TWO SCHEMES

In line with The Henry Smith Foundation's new strategy, Elevate Your Impact (2025-2030), they have launched Shout! to make sure young people are heard, especially when the world does not listen.

Focusing on organisations working with care-experienced young people, LGBT+ young people, and young people with learning disabilities and/or neurodivergences, eligible applicants can apply for up to £240,000 (£60,000 per year). Deadline 20 August 2025. Together We Begin will open 31 July funding organisations that provide early years parenting support and promote children's development through sustained, face-to-face work in the home with up to £150k (£40-50k per year).

Deadline for EOIs is 5pm on 28 August 2025.
