Our North West YouthStart team walked in Foyle pride to celebrate acceptance and love.



Staff were delighted to support two members group recently to complete Encirc Tackling Poverty Funding grants, a targeted fund established by Encirc and administered by the Fermanagh Trust. Each group were successful in getting £3000.

Carrowshee Park Sylvan Hill Community Association will launch a community fridge and warm meals initiative, alongside workshops on budgeting, cooking, and energy-saving—fostering resilience and reducing stigma.

Action for Children will support vulnerable young people in supported housing with budgeting workshops, food and fuel vouchers, and essential winter clothing.

We have worked with 43 young people from Melmount Community forum in Strabane and Northwest Islamic Youth. 



SPORT NI: OLYMPIC LEGACY FUND

The Olympic Legacy Fund is a £1 million investment by Sport NI and Crowdfunder UK aimed at enhancing community sports facilities to boost participation in sports. Projects can range from £1,000 to £50,000, with a deadline of February 20, 2026



Sport Northern Ireland

FORTE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION

Forte is a UK grant-making foundation supporting small and medium local organizations addressing issues in deprived urban and rural areas. They offer Small Grants (between £2,000 and £10,000) for organizations with annual incomes up to £250,000, and Major Grants (between £10,000 and £50,000) for organizations with turnovers up to £500,000, focusing on family support. Multi-year grants can total up to £100,000 over three years. There are no application deadlines
