



More resources to teach about the Mass!

The Catholic Kids Bulletins downloads contain bulletins for all Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation for diocese in the United States. If you live in an area with a Holy Day of Obligation that isn't included, please email me at catholickidsbulletin@outlook.com and I'll try to make it available in future downloads.

Ascension is listed without a date because most diocese move that feast to a Sunday; however, there are a few diocese in which it is a day of obligation. I left it without a date so you could use it on the Thursday or Sunday.

Some days, such as Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday aren't Holy Days of Obligation, but they are included in the download.

During Lent, there are Sundays (3rd, 4th, and 5th) in which churches can use either the Year C readings or the Year A Scrutinies. Both are included and labeled on the lower left hand corner.

Mass. It is called the Paschal candle. This candle will be lit for every Mass during the Easter season. The Easter season lasts for 50 days.

What is on a Paschal Candle?

Cross	+	Jesus died on the cross
Five grains of incense		A symbol of the 5 wounds of Jesus—in His hands, His feet, and His side
Five nails		Nails in Jesus' hands and feet and the spear in His side
Älpha & Omega	AΩ	Greek letters for the beginning and the end. Another name for Jesus
Chi Rho	*	The first 2 letters of "Christ" in Greek
Lamb		Jesus is the Lamb of God
IHS	ihs	The first 3 letters of "Jesus" in Greek
Butterfly	86	A symbol of resurrection
Bread & Wine	0	A symbol of the Eucharist

When the women visited Jesus' tomb, an angel appeared and told them that Jesus had risen!











Saint Faustina

Divine means God. Mercy means forgiveness.






