



Meet Bob Wilson

Bob Wilson began learning guitar at age 6, played in church several times weekly and from age 10, played the upright, string bass daily in school Orchestras, High School Symphonic and Jazz Bands for 6 years. He started touring professionally at 18, playing drums with The Messengers of Manassas, VA.



He quickly became a "hired gun" on bass guitar and fiddle for many other Southern Gospel and Bluegrass groups, climbing aboard various tour buses week after week to play their concerts. His freelance work extended into other genres including Country, Retro Country, Americana, 60's, 70's and 80's Rock, Blues and Jazz for fairs and festivals. He played fiddle and/or bass on most of those bands' and other band's albums, totaling almost 40 to date, at various studios.



He has been a session leader on several projects, has produced and engineered for over 20 years, and also has over 20 years of live sound reinforcement experience. He studied voice with Steve Hurst and Stephen Nix in Nashville and performance with Tom Jackson, also in Nashville. This has proven beneficial when producing main vocal and background vocal sessions.



Governor's Message | March 2024

Rotary's focus during the month of March is Water, Sanitation and Hygiene. Clean water, sanitation and good hygiene is a human right yet so many places in the world lack clean water and proper sanitation. When people, especially children, have access to clean water, sanitation, and hygiene, they are able to lead healthier, longer and more successful lives and they stay in school longer. We don't just build wells and walk away. Rotary members integrate water, sanitation, and hygiene into education projects. Just ask Walter Hughes, a member of the Rotary Club of Salem. Walter has been building wells for clean water for 20 years, implementing 2 or 3 water projects per year in Ghana. He has partnered with many Rotary clubs, districts and Rotaract clubs and is always looking for more clubs to partner with on Global Grants. Walter will be at District Conference and will be speaking on the WASH project during the Sunday session. You will not want to miss this!

So let me repeat that clean water is a basic human right that many are often denied. Think about this in 2024: There are 2.5 billion people in the world that lack access to improved sanitation and 748 million people that don't have clean drinking water. Nearly 1,400 children die each day from diseases caused by lack of sanitation and unsafe water. When people have access to clean water, they live healthier and more productive lives. What is YOUR Rotary Club doing to provide clean water to a community in need?





Background

The story behind Rock Haven is a rather personal one for our Immediate Past President, Blaine Elliott. During 2020, Blaine's wife suffered a traumatic brain injury (TBI) during a family mountain bike excursion. This injury required a substantial recovery period, extending well past her hospital discharge. Brain Injury Solutions (formerly Brain Injury Services of Southwest Virginia) helped her through this post-discharge period by providing guidance for non-hospital care and therapies, as it does for so many families in Southwest Virginia. For those directly suffering from TBI's, along with their families and friends, these additional services are invaluable for returning to a state of normalcy.

Rotary Club of the Blue Ridge was at near-collapse entering the 2021 holiday season, with sputtering member engagement and a passive service portfolio. Blaine, President-Elect at the time, knew the club needed a revitalization as it exited the Zoom era. His first thought was to host a signature event. The club's last signature event was a bicycling tournament in 2017, benefiting the Roanoke Valley iCan Shine Bike Camp. Being a musician himself, Blaine suggested a one-day music festival to benefit Brain Injury Solutions. Although the club was only 13 members strong at the time, no one backed down from the daunting proposal. Planning commenced, and the first Rock Haven became a reality in April 2023, with five bands performing well into the night and \$500 being donated to Brain Injury Solutions.

Today, we are supported by nearly 450 Rotary Clubs, mostly on the East Coast but also across the US. Our goal is to continue to increase giving in our strong donor base in Rotary Zones 33 and 34, while also attracting additional interest from other Rotary clubs, districts and zones, as well as non-Rotarians who share a similar passion for finding a cure for Alzheimer's.

In 2022, CART underwent a complete branding and imaging campaign with a new logo, new materials to support our volunteers and a "recurring giving" recognition program though our online donor portal. Donors who commit to a recurring gift of at least \$5 per month (or \$15/quarter or \$60/year) will be recognized as members of the newly created "Roger Ackerman Circle" and members who enroll will receive a limited-edition lapel pin.

An article in the May 2023 issue of Rotary magazine sparked interest from Rotarians around the country, expanding our support. A new initiative, Lunch A La CART, is a monthly zoom "lunch and learn" session with one of our researchers. Anyone is invited to attend for the presentation and Q&A session. 

Speaker Sponsor Instructions:

Scheduling Rotary Club Programs

General: Each member should try to sponsor at least one speaker for a program each Rotary year. To determine the dates programs are needed, please check the club calendar located on the district web site or our club's web site located at www.warrencountyrotary.org To schedule programs, please contact our Program Chair.

When scheduling programs, members should:

- Inform their speaker to limit their program to 20 minutes, including question and answer time.
- Request their speaker not promote their private business. Speakers may
 offer business cards or handouts about their business on a table at the close
 of the meeting.
- Remember that Rotary is non-partisan and the speaker should not promote any religion or political position.
- Youths cannot not be photographed or recorded without a signed Rotary Youth Waiver.
- Ask their speaker if they need audio-video support. Speakers should bring their program briefing saved to a USB drive using PowerPoint. We have a laptop, projection, and sound support.
- Inform their speaker they should arrive approximately 15 minutes prior to the start of the meeting to allow time for setting up the audio-video media.
- Call their speaker a couple of days prior to their schedule meeting as a reminder.

In the event our meeting is cancelled due to inclement weather, the member is responsible for notifying their speaker. Note: most club meeting weather cancellations follow the Warren County Schools policy – a school delay or cancellation results in the cancellation of our meeting.



A Quick Reference on How to Navigate DACdb

General: Our dacdb web site was designed to be very easy to use and intuitive. In only a few short minutes, you can be navigating the dacdb web site and using the power of the information available. The site is linked to the Rotary International web site and used to update the Rotary International data base of membership and club information. The following capabilities are available on this site: Club officers and member information, club committees and their membership; Club calendar, photos of members; District 7570 club meeting locations, times, directions etc.; club and district newsletters. The web site is designed to allow the club members and their committees to conduct the club's business using pmail/email.

How to Login to the web site.

Search for: dacdb login or dacdb sign in. Google, Safari, Chrome

You are now on the Login Page for the web site. Your Login Name is your email address; "0" is your temporary login. Please change your password after you find your member page – see login. If your login does not work, please contact Dave Hardy at davehardy1079@gmail.com or text: 540-671-3890.

After you log in, the basic selections are displayed across the top: Most club business will be conducted under the selection: My Club. You can update and review your data by selecting My Data.

How do I update my personal information?

General: The personal information that you are reviewing was initially updated with information provided by you to the Club's Secretary. Whenever you make a change to your record in dacdb, an email is automatically sent to the Club's Secretary notifying them of the change. The updated information is also used by Rotary International to update their membership records.

After you log in, the first page that opens will have a selection at the top for My Data at the top of the screen. Your personal screen is now displayed. To edit your data select Edit Member. Your information is listed by section across the top of the page: Member, Photo, RLI, Contact, PData, Login, Club, Business, Partner/Spouse, Bio, etc.

Please add your photo – select chose file from the photo page and upload a photo.

The primary sections you should review, and update are Photo, Contact, and Login.

Note: When you are completed with your review of your personal pages, select: Save in the upper right portion of the screen to save your data. After your data is saved, you may review your data. A summary of your changes will be automatically sent to the Club's Secretary.

Note: Some personal data may only be changed by the Club Secretary or Club Executive Secretary.

Where can I find my Club's Information?

Select My Club from the menu at the top of the page. Most of the information that you will use is located in this selection.

Clicking on the District at the top of the page will take you to the District 7570 home page.

On My Club page under Club Members at the top of the page, the club's officers are pictured with their position. Following the section with pictures of the club officers, the club members are shown.

The Club Committee symbol lists all the committees that we have set up for the Rotary Club of Warren County.

By selecting on one of the committee titles, the committee members with their phone numbers and email addresses are shown.

A Quick Reference on How to Navigate DACdb (continued)

By selecting pmail in the upper right corner of the page on one of the committees, you can send an pmail/email to each of the committee members.
