COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday August 5, 2026. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Paige Bjorn, Allen Ford, Norman Schippert, Emily Rademaker, city attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Paige Bjorn, seconded by Allen Ford to approve July 2026 minutes of the City Council and approved by all council members present.

Financial Report: The city will be preparing for the audit and property taxes to be sent to residents.

Announcements – Mayor Rogers announced that St. Aloysius is celebrating its 100th year and acknowledged this major milestone. The tree order has been placed for the tree giveaway on October 10th. The city is researching police vehicles including electric to the future replacement of the old police car which is starting to experience maintenance issues. The mayor thanked LG&E for taking care of the trees on

Peace Lane.

We had an issue with recycling but seems to be taken care of for the moment. The historical society is seeking volunteers to help organize the museum but to also to join the historical society to meet quarterly and maintain documents and artifacts etc.

Roads & Drainage/Environmental Board- (Bob Rogers) – Houston Lane (including replacing of culverts) and Powhatan paving bids have been received, and the job will go to Louisville Paving. The engineer will be meeting with them, and a traffic plan and timeline will be presented for residents. A motion to accept Louisville Paving's bid was made by Paige Bjorn, seconded by Norman Schippert and approve by all council members present.

New Business – Attorney Singler introduced the second reading of City of Pewee Valley Ordinance No. 4 Series 2026 An Ordinance of The City of Pewee Valley, Kentucky Establishing a Code Enforcement Board. This ordinance establishes a local 3-member enforcement board that converts an ordinance violation fine into a property lien without going to court, if an appeal right is given to the independent board. Norman Schippert made a motion to accept the second reading and adopt Ordinance 4, Series 2026, seconded by Paige Bjorn and approved by all council members present.

CITY OF PEWEE VALLEY ORDINANCE NO. 4, SERIES 2026 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CODE ENFORCEMENT BOARD

This ordinance creates a code enforcement board to allow residents to have a local appeal right for violation of city ordinance, under the authority of KRS 65.8801 to 65.8839. Using the state law authorizing the creation of a Code Enforcement Board also gives the city additional enforcement tools to resolve violations of city ordinance. 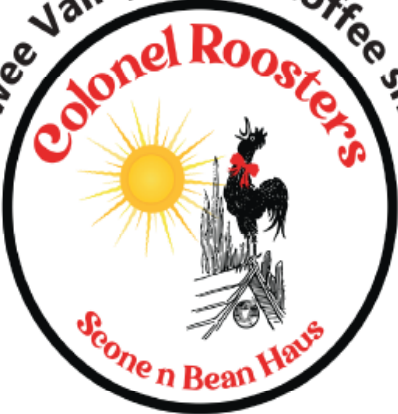

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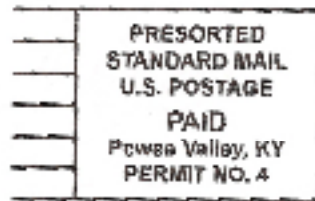
