COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday January 7, 2026. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Allen Ford, Henry Walser, Paige Bjorn, Emily Rademaker, Amanda Mudd, Norman Schippert, city attorney John Slinger and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser, seconded by Paige Bjorn to approve December 2025 minutes of the City Council and approved by all council members present.

Financial Report: The city continues to collect property taxes and 98% of the total collected. On December 1st, and continuing monthly, a penalty is assessed to unpaid taxes so please get them into town hall.

All residents are welcome to attend the tree board meetings; next meeting is January 19th. The city received a \$10,000 grant for the museum from the Head Trust Fund and a \$1100 grant for litter abatement.

Reports from Council

Public Safety- (Paige Bjorn) – Paige thanked chief Purcell for keeping the holidays safe.

Insurance/Water Quality/ABC Administration - (Henry Walser) - No report

Communication/Website - (Amanda Mudd) – Thanked everyone for their help with the Yule log festival.

Sidewalks/Festivities- (Emily Rademaker) – A meeting is planned with the city engineer to discuss a drainage issue for the proposed sidewalk on Maple from La Grange Road to Elm, a few trees will be removed to make space for the path.

Town Hall - (Norman Schippert) – Museum renovation continues to progress with paint and flooring as the next step.

Waste Management/Central Park- (Allen Ford) – Republic services are running smoothly. A meeting is being rescheduled with a contractor to discuss paver repair. Bob asked Allen to start up historical meetings again and push public engagement for residents to join.

Roads & Drainage/Environmental Board- (Bob Rogers) – The city has a new engineer, Mark Madison, from Milestone Design group.

New Business –

A motion was made by Paige Bjorn to reappoint Wayne Allen to the Planning Commission, seconded by Henry Walser and approved by all council members.

Attorney Singler summarized city of Pewee Valley, Ky Ordinance 7, Series 2025 An Ordinance Repealing and Replacing the existing Oldham County Comprehensive Plan.

A motion was made by Paige Bjorn and seconded by Amanda Mudd to accept the second reading and adoption of Pewee Valley, Kentucky Ordinance 7, Series 2025, roll call vote was taken and all council members voted in favor.

Open Comments – Zack Wilt, director of Oldham County Emergency Management, introduced himself and reassured everyone that in case of an emergency there is a plan in place, our fire departments are consistently staying up to date with trainings and do a great job. Any questions, Zack stated he is always available and can be reached at OCEM 502-222-0799. The mayor expressed his confidence in his meetings with the PVFD regarding emergency scenarios and the plans in place.


