COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday July 1, 2026. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Paige Bjorn, Henry Walser, Amanda Mudd, Allen Ford, city attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser, seconded by Paige Bjorn to approve June 2026 minutes of the City Council and approved by all council members present.

Public Safety- (Paige Bjorn) – Please stay hydrated and check on your neighbors during the extreme heat.

Insurance/Water Quality/ABC Administration - (Henry Walser) – No report

Communication/Website- (Amanda Mudd) – Check FB page for ordinance regarding fireworks in the county. The FB page had 6,295 views, 1,223 views for city council meeting, 2 reach alerts were issued in June, and the city website had 18 click to calls, 1,444 site visits (50% coming from Ai), and 5 form submissions.

Sidewalks/Festivities- (Emily Rademaker) – Farmers' Market is underway on Thursdays from 5:30 to 7:30 stop by the parking lot of St James' Episcopal Church for baked goods, produce, craft items, plants, and more.

Summer Picnic is Saturday, August 8. There will be a Monarchs concert in the town square and kid activities in the park. The fire department will be raising funds by selling hamburgers, brats, and hot dogs. Come out and enjoy an evening outside with your neighbors. The Tree Giveaway, Fall Festival and Master Planning Community Open House are all planned for Saturday October 10. The council has reviewed the preliminary survey that kicks off the master plan development. It will be available in the next couple of weeks. To successfully complete this phase, we need significant input from residents, businesses and visitors to our community. Information gathered during the survey will determine the focus of the community input sought during the open house. The survey will be sent to residents and businesses and will also be available on the website. Maple Avenue sidewalk project is scheduled to be poured this month by Flynn brothers



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contracting. The new sidewalk will be on the right-hand side and run from Highway 146 to Elm Street. Plans are available for review at town hall. Thanks to St Aloysius for trimming back the bushes along Central Avenue that were encroaching on the sidewalk. A friendly reminder: the city sidewalk ordinance requires property owners to maintain the accessibility of sidewalks that cross their property.

New Business – Attorney Singler introduced City of Pewee Valley Ordinance No. 4 Series 2026 An Ordinance of The City of Pewee Valley, Kentucky Establishing a Code Enforcement Board. This ordinance establishes a local enforcement board that converts an ordinance violation fine into a property lien without going to court, as long as an appeal right is given to an independent board.

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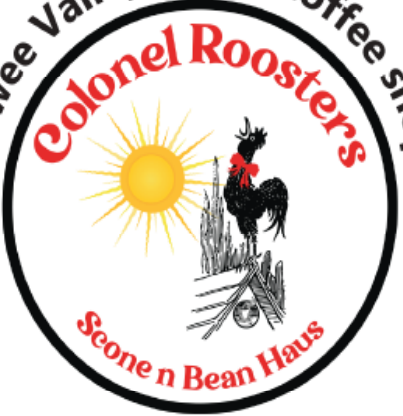

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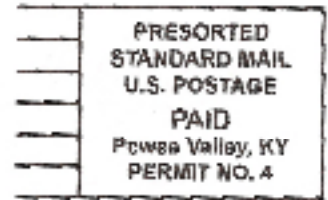
