

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday September 3, 2025. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Henry Walser, Rhonda Laguna, Norman Schippert, Emily Rademaker, Amanda Mudd, city attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Henry Walser made a motion to approve August 2025 minutes of the City Council Meeting seconded by Amanda Mudd and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Sidewalks/Festivities- (Emily Rademaker) – Sidewalk committee will meet again on Sept 10th at 4pm to talk about a pathway on Maple Avenue. Movie in the park will be “The Wild Robot”, starting at 8 p.m. on September 12th., craft at 7:30 and free popcorn. A fall festival is happening on Oct 4th, with vendors, food and drinks, live music and kids’ activities. The overlay committee will be meeting on Sept. 25th at 3 pm to discuss submitting the certificate of appropriateness for the existing overlay district and possibly hiring a consultant to create a master plan for the city.

Waste Management/Central Park- (Rhonda Laguna) – No report

Roads & Drainage/Environmental Board- (Bob Rogers) – Bids are being collected by the county for paving projects. The mayor is hopeful that Rollington will be completed in the next 2 to 4 weeks. Michael Logsdon stated that he is working on getting a 3 way stop installed at Houston and Rollington. The city blazer is being repaired.

New Business

Attorney Singler summarized MO 5, which is a request to the planning commission to review and submit recommendations supporting the findings attorney Singler has compiled from the council and overlay meetings to change the minimum lot size to 1.5 acres. Norman Schippert made a motion to adopt City of Pewee Valley, Kentucky Municipal Order 5, Series 2025 A Municipal Order Requesting a Text Amendment to the Oldham County Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance Relating to The Minimum Lot Size in Pewee Valley, Ky, this was seconded by Henry Walser and all council members present voted in favor.
