COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday July 2, 2025. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Paige Bjorn, Henry Walser, Norman Schippert and Amanda Mudd, city attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney. Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Henry Walser made a motion to approve the June 2025 minutes of the City Council Meeting, second by Paige Bjorn and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial Report: Updated financials were presented.The city will be preparing for the audit.

Police Report:
