

Angels Among Us Standing in the Presence of God The Angel Gabriel and Zechariah

November 30, 2025

Luke 1:5-25

In the time of Herod king of Judea there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah; his wife Elizabeth was also a descendant of Aaron. Both of them were righteous in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commands and decrees blamelessly. But they were childless because Elizabeth was not able to conceive, and they were both very old. Once when Zechariah's division was on duty and he was serving as priest before God, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the assembled worshipers were praying outside. Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John. He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before he is born. He will bring back many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." Zechariah asked the angel, "How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well along in years." The angel said to him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their appointed time." Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zechariah and wondering why he stayed so long in the temple. When he came out, he could not speak to them. They realized he had seen a vision in the temple, for he kept making signs to them but remained unable to speak. When his time of service was completed, he returned home. After this his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and for five months remained in seclusion. "The Lord has done this for me," she said. "In these days he has shown his favor and taken away my disgrace among the people."

Food for Thought

Read Luke 1:5-25, the account of the angel Gabriel's visit to Zechariah.

In verse 10, as Zechariah was in the temple, "all assembled worshipers were praying outside." We see here the power of prayer. If you had to think of one prayer that is truly burdening your heart, what is that prayer?

Zechariah had doubts regarding the angel's news. What are those things that are doubts or questions with respect to your faith and God's message to you?

Zechariah was to be silent the whole time his wife Elizabeth was expecting. When has being silent been a gift? How can you create quiet moments in this busy season? What might you make space to pray about, ponder?

Happy Thanksgiving, Still Waters Family and Friends! We hope and pray that your Thanksgiving is blessed, that you are able to find joy and peace, even in an unsettled world and lives that are not perfect! Prayers that you sense God among and with you! This weekend begins the Advent season, which starts each year the fourth weekend prior to Christmas. Our series is called "Angels Among Us," and each week in worship during Advent, we will explore the four angelic visits surrounding the birth of Jesus. This weekend we will begin with the message, "Standing in the Presence of God," as we explore the appearance of angel Gabriel to Zechariah. In this series we will find that the angels of Christmas *still* bring "good news of great joy for all the people," including you and me. I look forward to seeing you!

ADVENT STUDY, Offerings: Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays

The Advent season (the 4 weeks prior to Christmas) will begin November 30! we invite you to join us in an Advent study, corresponding to our weekend worship series.

Choose the study that works best in your schedule! We'll offer the 3-week study on

- Mondays at 7:00 p.m. (facilitated by Pastor Lori) beginning December 1
- Tuesdays, at 10:00 a.m. (facilitated by Robin Jasinski) beginning December 2
- Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. (facilitated by Jena Metzler) beginning December 3.

The study will be based on a book by Pastor Susan Robb called "**The Angels of Christmas.**" In it, we will explore the four angelic visits surrounding the birth of Jesus. In the Bible, angels are messengers. The angels of Christmas came to deliver important messages to people who were hoping for God to intervene in a mighty way. The angels of Christmas still bring "good news of great joy for all the people," including you and me. Based the book by Susan Robb, come explore this special way that God is working in our world and in our lives this Advent season. We invite you on the journey with us! Book is \$19. Advent Candle Lighters- Great Opportunity!

Would you and/or your family like to be a part of our weekly worship service lighting of the Advent candles? Each Saturday night and Sunday morning worship service from the first weekend of Advent (December 1) through Christmas Eve (choose between worship services at 10:00 a.m., 2:00, 4:00, 6:00) we will have an individual/couple/family share in the lighting of the advent candle that week. (The first week of Advent they'll light the first candle, the 2nd week, the first two and so on.) We will have a short script for one or more person to read, as well as have one or more persons light the candle as part of worship. Pastor Lori will email you instructions and a script to read. Choose the day and worship service in which you'd like to participate, by signing up online or on your Connection Card! What an amazing way to be the community of faith together as we make the Advent journey to Christmas! Please note: no Saturday worship Nov 29 or Dec 6, as those will be at Enchantment in the Park with our Youth Praise Team and Praise Team! Also, we will be looking to have practices, so Pastor Lori will work to find a time (after worship on a Sunday or on one of two Monday evenigns) to practice. The Advent Candle Lighting will be done in conjunction with music and an additonal Advent Reading (see below), so practicing will be important. Thank you! This will be so special!

Advent Readers- Another Great Opportunity!

In addition to but different than the Advent Candle Lighters, we will have a Reader who will share a reading that centers our hearts and brings us into the Advent Theme of the week. This person will practice the reading once on one of two Monday evenings or after worship on a Sunday. <u>Christmas Store: Volunteer Opportunities Still Available!</u>

Christmas Store is one of our biggest signature events of the year. This is an event in which 30-40 families who are going through some difficult times are invited to a Christmas event in which they enjoy a wonderful breakfast, get a family portrait taken, shop for amazing items for their children at a fraction of retail, and have a chance to meet for prayer with our pastor and Congregational Care Coordinator. Preparations for this year's Christmas Store on Saturday, December 6th are in full swing. If you still hope to be a part of this magical event, there is still time to volunteer. We are looking for a few more people to help in just a few areas:

<u>Building Prep</u>: Help to clear the children's area on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>December 2nd</u>, <u>starting at 2pm</u>. This involves moving furniture to empty the spaces that will be used for the store. See Al if you have questions.

- <u>Floaters/Car Loaders</u>: On Christmas Store Day, **Saturday**, **Dec. 6th**, take one of two volunteer shifts, one from **8-11am** or **11am-2pm**. Your main duties would be to load the wrapped Christmas presents into the cars along with being present to help keep things running smoothly.
- <u>Clean Up</u>: This volunteer position starts at around 2:30pm on Saturday, Dec 6th. We need help boxing the remaining toys and items and moving those boxes into the waiting trucks and trailers to be stored for next year. Help is also needed to clean and reset the sanctuary and return furniture to the children's area.
- <u>Toy Hauler:</u> Help transport toys! Two shifts, one getting toys TO the church in preparation for the Christmas store, and one to transport toys FROM the church, after the completion of Christmas store. On **Wednesday, Dec 3rd, at 6 p.m. transport toys** from the storage location in Jackson to the church. If you have a truck or other large vehicle, that would be great! And/Or On **Saturday, Dec. 6, at 3 pm transport toys** and decorations from the church to the storage location in Jackson.
