Holy water is a significant **sacramental** in the Catholic Church, symbolizing purification and blessing, and is often discussed in the context of teachings from United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. (USCCB) Holy water is blessed water used in various Catholic Rituals, primarily as a **reminder of Baptism and a means of sanctification**. It serves as a sacramental that helps the faithful recall their baptism and the grace received through it. The Church encourages the use of Holy Water for its **spiritual benefits including: protection from evil, healing and the forgiveness of venial sins**.

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The Baptism of the Lord is a significant feast in the Catholic Church, commemorating the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, and it emphasizes the importance of baptism in the Christian faith.

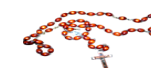
