Sign up now for Illinois Pro-Life Mass and attend Illinois Pro-Life March afterward

– On **Thursday, March 19**, you are invited to join thousands of pro-life advocates, being a joyful witness to life and raising your voice for the voiceless at the Illinois Pro-Life Mass and March. The day begins with Mass at 10 a.m. at the Exposition Building on the grounds of the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield, celebrated by Bishop Thomas John Paprocki and concelebrated by bishops and priests from across the state. You must register for the Mass by going to dio.org. After the Mass, there is a **rally at the capitol at 1 p.m.** with guest speakers, and then a march around **the capitol at 2 p.m.** **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will also be going on at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception from noon to 5 p.m.** Confessions at the Cathedral will also be available from **1:30 – 5 p.m.** Last year, about 2,000 people attended the Illinois Pro-Life March, the vast majority being students from Catholic grade schools, high schools, and Newman Centers. Priests, seminarians, religious, and the lay faithful from every corner of the diocese and the state also showed up in strong numbers.

CATECHETICAL CORNER

The Liturgical Year

For Catholics, the Church year is the **Liturgical Year**, a sequence of seasons and feasts that are celebrated in the liturgy - the official public prayer of the Church - during a year's time. Unlike our traditional 365-day calendar, the purpose of the Liturgical Year Calendar is not to mark the passage of time, but to more fully celebrate and understand the entire mystery of Jesus Christ, from his Incarnation and birth until his Ascension, the day of Pentecost, and the expectation of his return in glory.

The liturgical year is made up of six seasons:

Advent - Four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth.

Christmas - Recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ.

Ordinary Time – First of two parts. During this season, we celebrate the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and what it means to be his disciple.

Lent - Six-week period to pray, give alms, and fast in order to grow closer to Jesus and to one another.

Sacred Paschal Triduum - The holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Easter - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit.

Ordinary Time – Second part lasting about six months after Easter Time. The faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people. The season is called Ordinary Time because the weeks are named in numerical order.

Each liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent during the preceding calendar year (i.e., the First Sunday of Advent in 2025 began the 2026 liturgical year).

Another Pilgrimage Opportunity

Several churches in diocese available for Special Year of St. Francis pilgrimage so you can receive indulgence — Pope Leo XIV declared a Special Year of St. Francis to mark the 800th anniversary of his death, running until January 2027. During this time, the faithful can obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting Franciscan churches or praying spiritually if unable to travel, following the usual conditions of going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and praying for the pope's intentions (e.g., one Our Father and Hail Mary). For example, in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, one can make a pilgrimage to St. Francis of Assisi Church in Teutopolis, St. Francis of Assisi Church in Springfield, St. Francis of Assisi Church in Hardin, or St. Francis Adoration Chapel in Alton (home of the Sisters of St. Francis of Martyr St. George).
