"Imagine if the bishop or priest celebrating Mass came out wearing shorts, a tank top, and flip-flops! Most people would be shocked and would not hesitate to voice their objections. So why does there seem to be a different standard for the laity attending Mass? Yes, the celebrant is ordained to the ministerial priesthood, but all the baptized belong to the common priesthood of the Christian faithful. Both the clergy and laity come to offer sacrifice at Holy Mass and receive Our Lord in holy Communion. The clergy have prescribed vestments, but the laity should also show respect for God in His house of worship by dressing appropriately with proper reverence, not as if they are going to the beach or a picnic. *Dressing properly for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is a great way to express in a concrete and practical way that we do believe that Jesus Christ is really present at Mass and to show our love and esteem for Our Lord and Savior as He comes into our hearts in holy Communion.*"

1. **Make the Sign of the Cross.** (Start today)
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
5. Say the *Glory Be*.
6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten *Hail Mary's* while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)

After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer: V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. *Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen. (Rosaries are available)* USCCB

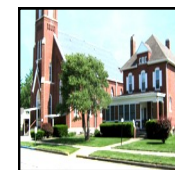
