

ZMTI 104 Paul's Letters

At the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Explain how Paul's background helped shape his writings and theology.
- Grasp the distinctives of Pauline theology and doctrine.
- Articulate the context and history of the Pauline epistles.

Text for the course, Apostle of the Last Days: The Life, Letters, and Theology of Paul by C. Marvin Pate

Course Requirements:

- Attendance. Participants must have 80% attendance to receive a passing grade.
- Assigned Reading
- Class Discussions
- Participants will write a paper on one of the Pauline Epistles. The paper should include the following information: Discussion on the recipient(s) of the letter, issue(s) dealt with by the letter, main themes, and application to the life of the participant. The paper should be 3-5 pages, double-spaced, 12-point font with title page. Due week 7 of class. (Remember that plagiarizing is cheating.)

Week 3-1 and 2 Thessalonians

Week 4- 1 and 2 Corinthians

Week 7- Ephesians and Philemon (Paper Due).

Week 8- The Pastoral Epistles (1 and 2 Timothy, Titus).
