7. Discussion and Approval of Executive Director's Recommended Grant Awards

a. **Economic Development Fund**

- Innovation Works, Inc. \$1.1 million: Grants or loans for start-up business support and acquisition and development of vacant and blighted commercial properties to support 5 10 businesses establish storefronts or offices in the WNA & McCulloh Focus Development Node, includes \$50,000 for operational support.
- Za Gualay LLC d/b/a Habesha Flavor \$500,000: \$475,000 for acquisition and development of two commercial properties to build a food co-op, café, and food product manufacturing space in the WNA & McCulloh Focus Development Node, and \$25,000 for operational support.
- <u>Styled4You Boutique</u> \$500,000 : \$475,000 for acquisition and development of two vacant and blighted commercial properties for construction into a women's clothing retail storefront in the *WNA & McCulloh Focus Development Node*, and \$25,000 for Operational support.
- Requity Foundation, Inc. \$500,000: \$300,000 for acquisition and development of 2 vacant and blighted properties in the *Mondawmin & Easterwood Focus Development Node* for vocational education training at Carver Vocational-Technical High School to meet the Maryland Blueprint for Education goal of career readiness; \$100,000 for construction materials, clothing, and safety equipment for students; and \$100,000 for operational support.

- Rebirth Development \$250,000 : \$175,000 for acquisition and development of 2801 WNA (vacant lot into green space flower garden) and 2803 WNA (blighted structure into a commercial building) for WNADA Annex office building and shared community office and meeting space for community development organizations and neighborhood associations; \$75,000 acquisition and development of 1 2 single-family row homes to be sold at no more than \$275,000 in the 2700 2900 West North Avenue Focus Development Node.
- One Saint Home, LLC \$250,000 : \$237,500 for acquisition and development of 3 5 single-family row homes to be sold at or no more than \$275,000 in the 2700 2900 West North Avenue Focus Development Node, and \$12,500 for operational support.

- <u>3012 Garrison LLC dba Laycon Construction</u> \$500,000 : \$475,000 for acquisition and development of 5 -7 single-family row homes to be sold at or no more than \$275,000 in the *2700 2900 West North Avenue Focus Development Node*, and \$25,000 for operational support.
- Baltimore Roots Development LLC \$250,000: \$237,500 for acquisition and development of 3
 5 single-family row homes to be sold at or no more than \$275,000 in the 2700 2900 West North Avenue Focus Development Node, and \$12,500 for operational support.
- Real Estate Farmers LLC dba The Real Estate Farmers \$250,000: \$237,500 for acquisition and development of 3 5 single-family row homes to be sold at or no more than \$275,000 in the 2700 2900 West North Avenue Focus Development Node, and \$12,500 for operational support.
- **Kouture Enterprises LLC \$250,000**: \$237,500 for acquisition and development of 3 5 single-family row homes to be sold at or no more than \$275,000 in the *2700 2900 West North Avenue Focus Development Node*, and \$12,500 for operational support.

- Parity Baltimore Incorporated The SOS Fund \$200,000: \$125,000 for emergency housing code repairs of 25 homes (at no more than \$5,000 per home), and \$75,000 for operational support to provide financial interventions, municipal service assistance and civil legal referrals for 50 legacy homeowners in the Live@Coppin and Mondawmin and Easterwood Focus Development Nodes.
- Coppin Heights CDC \$75,000 : \$75,000 operational grant to support staff salaries and fringe benefits for the development of 2700 2900 Blk WNA.
- **DRUM Healthy Families, Inc. \$100,000**: \$100,000 Closing cost to acquire 2100 Eutaw Pl which is the actual building currently being leased by DRUM Healthy Families, Inc.
