Reflection From Fr. Maurice

We spend much of our lives searching for something that will finally satisfy us. We look for security, success, comfort, or recognition, hoping that once we have enough, we will be at peace. Yet those things, good as they may be, can never satisfy the deepest longing of the human heart.

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that the Kingdom of God is the greatest treasure we will ever find. Like the man who discovered a hidden treasure or the merchant who found a pearl of great value, we are invited to recognize that nothing compares to a life lived with Christ. When we truly discover Him, our priorities begin to change. What once seemed most important slowly yields to what is eternal.

That is why we should pray for the gift of wisdom. Wisdom helps us recognize what truly matters and choose what will lead us closer to God. It teaches us that faith is not simply one part of our lives—it is the foundation of everything else.

This week, take a moment to ask yourself: What is the greatest treasure in my life? The answer to that question will shape the choices we make each day. May we always have the wisdom to put Christ first, for He is the treasure that never fades.

Sin embargo, todas esas cosas, aunque sean buenas, nunca podrán llenar el anhelo más profundo del corazón humano.

El Evangelio de este domingo nos recuerda que el Reino de Dios es el tesoro más grande que podremos encontrar. Como el hombre que descubrió un tesoro escondido o el comerciante que encontró una perla de gran valor, también nosotros estamos llamados a reconocer que nada se compara con una vida vivida junto a Cristo. Cuando de verdad lo encontramos, nuestras prioridades comienzan a cambiar. Lo que antes parecía lo más importante va dejando su lugar a lo que es eterno.

Por eso debemos pedir al Señor el don de la sabiduría. La sabiduría nos ayuda a reconocer lo que realmente vale la pena y a elegir aquello que nos acerca más a Dios. Nos enseña que la fe no es simplemente una parte de nuestra vida, sino el fundamento sobre el cual se sostiene todo lo demás.

Esta semana, tómate un momento para preguntarte: ¿Cuál es el mayor tesoro de mi vida? La respuesta a esa pregunta dará forma a las decisiones que tomes cada día. Que el Señor nos conceda la sabiduría para poner siempre a Cristo en el primer lugar, porque Él es el tesoro que nunca se acaba.

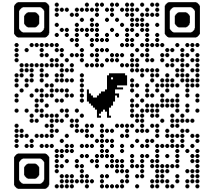
