Transfiguration

The second Sunday of Lent invites us deeper into our Lenten pilgrimage with a vision of hope amid sacrifice. The readings reveal God's faithful promises and the glimpse of glory that sustains us on the way to the cross and resurrection. The Gospel (Matthew 17:1-9) presents the Transfiguration: Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, where His face shines like the sun and His clothes become dazzling white. Moses and Elijah appear in glory, speaking with Him, and the Father's voice declares from the cloud, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." The disciples fall prostrate in awe, yet Jesus touches them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." He then leads them down the mountain toward His Passion. The Transfiguration is no mere spectacle; it is God's gift to fortify the disciples—and us—for the suffering ahead. In the midst of Lent's disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we too climb the "mountain" of encounter with Christ. In quiet prayer, in the sacrament of Reconciliation, or in acts of charity, we catch glimpses of His divine light breaking into our lives. These moments remind us that the cross is not the end; resurrection glory awaits those who listen to the Beloved Son.

El segundo domingo de Cuaresma nos invita a profundizar en nuestra peregrinación cuaresmal con una visión de esperanza en medio del sacrificio. Las lecturas revelan las fieles promesas de Dios y un atisbo de gloria que nos sostiene en el camino hacia la cruz y la resurrección. El Evangelio (Mateo 17,1-9) presenta la Transfiguración: Jesús guía a Pedro, Santiago y Juan a una montaña alta, donde su rostro brilla como el sol y sus vestiduras se tornan de una blancura deslumbrante. Moisés y Elías aparecen en gloria, hablando con él, y la voz del Padre declara desde la nube: «Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien me complace; escúchenlo». Los discípulos caen postrados, asombrados, pero Jesús los toca y les dice: «Levántense, no tengan miedo». Luego los guía montaña abajo hacia su Pasión. La Transfiguración no es un simple espectáculo; es un don de Dios para fortalecer a los discípulos —y a nosotros— para el sufrimiento que nos espera. En medio de las disciplinas cuaresmales de oración, ayuno y limosna, nosotros también ascendemos a la "montaña" del encuentro con Cristo. En la oración silenciosa, en el sacramento de la Reconciliación o en los actos de caridad, vislumbramos su luz divina irrumpir en nuestras vidas. Estos momentos nos recuerdan que la cruz no es el fin; la gloria de la resurrección aguarda a quienes escuchan al Hijo Amado.


