The Good Shepherd

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is often called “Good Shepherd Sunday,” and the Gospel invites us to listen again to the voice of Christ, our Shepherd. Jesus says, “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.” These are simple words, but they reveal something profound about the Christian life. To be a disciple is not first about mastering ideas or following rules—it is about recognizing a voice. The voice of Christ is not loud or coercive. It is steady, personal, and filled with truth. He calls each of us by name, not as part of a crowd, but as someone known and loved. But here’s the challenge: there are many voices competing for our attention. The world is noisy—opinions, anxieties, distractions, and temptations all clamor to be heard. If we are not intentional, it becomes easy to lose track of the Shepherd’s voice altogether. Do the question for us this week is direct: *Do I know His voice?* Not just in theory, but in practice. Do I spend time in prayer, in silence, in Scripture, so that I can recognize Him when He speaks? Because if we don’t listen, we can’t follow. The good news is this: the Shepherd never stops calling. Even when we wander, even when we are distracted or stubborn, His voice remains. And it is always leading us toward life—toward peace, toward truth, and ultimately toward eternal life with Him. Let’s ask for the grace not just to hear, but to follow.

El Cuarto Domingo de Pascua es conocido como el “Domingo del Buen Pastor”, y el Evangelio nos invita a escuchar nuevamente la voz de Cristo, nuestro Pastor. Jesús dice: “Mis ovejas escuchan mi voz; yo las conozco y ellas me siguen”. Son palabras sencillas, pero revelan algo profundo sobre la vida cristiana. Ser discípulo no consiste primero en dominar ideas o cumplir reglas, sino en reconocer una voz. La voz de Cristo no es fuerte ni impositiva. Es constante, personal y llena de verdad. Él llama a cada uno por su nombre, no como parte de una multitud, sino como alguien conocido y amado. Pero aquí está el desafío: hay muchas voces que compiten por nuestra atención. El mundo es ruidoso—opiniones, ansiedades, distracciones y tentaciones buscan hacerse escuchar. Si no somos intencionales, fácilmente podemos perder de vista la voz del Pastor. Entonces la pregunta para esta semana es directa: *¿Conozco su voz?* No solo en teoría, sino en la práctica. *¿Dedico tiempo a la oración, al silencio, a la Sagrada Escritura, para poder reconocerlo cuando habla?* Porque si no escuchamos, no podemos seguir. La buena noticia es esta: el Pastor nunca deja de llamar. Incluso cuando nos desviamos, cuando estamos distraídos o somos tercos, su voz permanece. Y siempre nos guía hacia la vida—hacia la paz, hacia la verdad y, en última instancia, hacia la vida eterna con Él. Pidamos la gracia no solo de escuchar, sino de seguirlo.

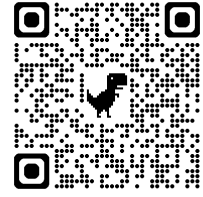
