### The Way, the Truth, and the Life

For the Fifth Sunday the Gospel presents Jesus' words at the Last Supper: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." These are not just comforting words—they are a bold and definitive claim about who Christ is. In a world that offers many paths and competing truths, Jesus does not present Himself as one option among many. He is the way. Not a philosophy, not a vague spirituality, but a Person. To follow Christ is not simply to adopt a set of beliefs, but to enter into a relationship that directs every part of our lives. He is also the truth. That means our lives must be grounded in Him, not in shifting opinions or cultural trends. Truth is not something we create; it is something we receive—and ultimately, it is Someone we encounter. And He is the life. So many people today are searching for meaning, for fulfillment, for something that lasts. Jesus tells us clearly: that life is found in Him. Not in success, not in comfort, not in anything this world can offer apart from God. But the Gospel also gives us a challenge through St. Thomas: "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" It's an honest question—and one we often share. We want clarity, certainty, control. Yet Jesus doesn't give a map; He gives Himself. That means faith is not about having everything figured out. It is about trusting Him enough to follow, even when the path is unclear. So the question for us this week is straightforward: Do I really live as if Christ is the way, the truth, and the life? Or do I try to build my life on something else? If we're honest, there are areas where we still hold back. Bring those to Him. Because He is not just showing us the way—He is leading us, step by step, to the Father.

Para el Quinto Domingo de Pascua el Evangelio presenta las palabras de Jesús en la Última Cena: "Yo soy el camino, la verdad y la vida. Nadie va al Padre sino por mí." Estas no son solo palabras de consuelo, sino una afirmación firme y decisiva sobre quién es Cristo. En un mundo que ofrece muchos caminos y verdades en competencia, Jesús no se presenta como una opción entre muchas. Él es *el* camino. No una filosofía ni una espiritualidad vaga, sino una Persona. Seguir a Cristo no es simplemente adoptar un conjunto de creencias, sino entrar en una relación que orienta toda nuestra vida. Él es también la verdad. Esto significa que nuestra vida debe estar fundada en Él, no en opiniones cambiantes o tendencias culturales. La verdad no es algo que nosotros creamos; es algo que recibimos—y, en última instancia, es Alguien a quien encontramos. Y Él es la vida. Muchas personas hoy buscan sentido, plenitud, algo que permanezca. Jesús nos dice claramente que esa vida se encuentra en Él: no en el éxito, no en la comodidad, ni en nada que este mundo pueda ofrecer sin Dios. Pero el Evangelio también nos muestra el desafío a través de Santo Tomás: "Señor, no sabemos adónde vas; ¿cómo podemos saber el camino?" Es una pregunta honesta, y también nuestra pregunta frecuente. Queremos claridad, certeza y control. Pero Jesús no da un mapa; se da a sí mismo. Eso significa que la fe no consiste en tener todo resuelto, sino en confiar lo suficiente como para seguirlo, incluso cuando el camino no está claro. Así que la pregunta para esta semana es directa: ¿Vivo realmente como si Cristo fuera el camino, la verdad y la vida? ¿O estoy construyendo mi vida sobre otra cosa? Si somos honestos, hay áreas en las que aún nos resistimos. Llévalas a Él, porque no solo nos muestra el camino: Él mismo nos conduce, paso a paso, hacia el Padre.

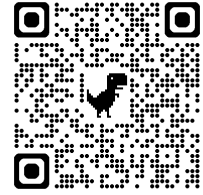
