### The Raising of Lazarus

In the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent (John 11:1–45), we encounter one of the most powerful signs in the ministry of Jesus: the raising of Lazarus. At first glance, the story appears to be about physical death and miraculous restoration. But its deeper meaning reaches far beyond the tomb of Lazarus. When Jesus arrives in Bethany, Lazarus has already been dead for four days. Martha meets him with a mixture of faith and grief: “Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.” Yet even in her sorrow, she expresses trust that God will act. Jesus responds with words that stand at the heart of Christian hope: “*I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live.*” Before raising Lazarus, Jesus weeps. This moment reminds us that God is not distant from our suffering. Christ enters fully into human grief. He stands beside us in our losses, our disappointments, and the many “tombs” we experience in life—sin, discouragement, and spiritual death. Then Jesus calls out: “Lazarus, come out!” With that command, life returns and the power of death is broken. As Lent draws toward its climax, the Church invites us to hear that same call. Christ desires to free us from whatever binds us. The One who called Lazarus from the grave now calls each of us to new life—through repentance, faith, and the grace of the coming Easter.

En el Evangelio del Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma (Juan 11, 1–45), encontramos uno de los signos más poderosos del ministerio de Jesús: la resurrección de Lázaró. A primera vista, la historia parece tratar sobre la muerte física y una restauración milagrosa. Pero su significado más profundo va mucho más allá de la tumba de Lázaró. Cuando Jesús llega a Betania, Lázaró ya lleva cuatro días muerto. Marta sale a su encuentro con una mezcla de fe y dolor: «Señor, si hubieras estado aquí, mi hermano no habría muerto». Sin embargo, incluso en medio de su tristeza, expresa su confianza en que Dios actuará. Jesús responde con palabras que están en el corazón de la esperanza cristiana: «Yo soy la resurrección y la vida; el que cree en mí, aunque haya muerto, vivirá». Antes de resucitar a Lázaró, Jesús llora. Este momento nos recuerda que Dios no está distante de nuestro sufrimiento. Cristo entra plenamente en el dolor humano. Él está a nuestro lado en nuestras pérdidas, nuestras decepciones y en las muchas “tumbas” que experimentamos en la vida: el pecado, el desaliento y la muerte espiritual. Entonces Jesús grita: «¡Lázaró, sal fuera!». Con ese mandato, la vida regresa y el poder de la muerte queda vencido. A medida que la Cuaresma se acerca a su momento culminante, la Iglesia nos invita a escuchar ese mismo llamado. Cristo desea liberarnos de todo aquello que nos ata. Aquel que llamó a Lázaró fuera del sepulcro ahora llama a cada uno de nosotros a una vida nueva—por medio del arrepentimiento, la fe y la gracia de la Pascua que se acerca.

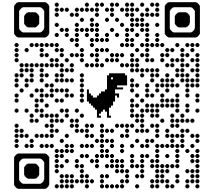
