The Disciplines of Lent

As we approach the holy season of Lent, the Church invites us once more into the desert with Jesus. Marked with ashes on Ash Wednesday, we hear the ancient call: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." This is not a season of mere self-denial, but a sacred journey of conversion, drawing closer to Christ through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—the three pillars of Lent. These three traditional disciplines help us open our hearts to God's transforming grace:

Prayer deepens our relationship with the Father, turning our gaze toward Him in the quiet of our hearts.

Fasting frees us from attachments, teaching us that "man does not live by bread alone."

Almsgiving expresses love for our neighbor, sharing what we have with those in need.

Lent is ultimately about love—love for God expressed in prayer, love for ourselves expressed in fasting that purifies, and love for others expressed in generosity. As we walk toward the cross and the empty tomb, may these disciplines help us die to sin and rise with Christ in newness of life.

Al acercarnos al tiempo sagrado de la Cuaresma, la Iglesia nos invita una vez más al desierto con Jesús. Marcados con ceniza el Miércoles de Ceniza, escuchamos el antiguo llamado: «Arrepiéntanse y crean en el Evangelio». Este no es un tiempo de mera abnegación, sino un camino sagrado de conversión, acercándonos a Cristo mediante la oración, el ayuno y la limosna: los tres pilares de la Cuaresma. Estas tres disciplinas tradicionales nos ayudan a abrir nuestros corazones a la gracia transformadora de Dios: La **oración** profundiza nuestra relación con el Padre, volviendo nuestra mirada hacia Él en la quietud de nuestros corazones.

El **ayuno** nos libera de los apegos, enseñándonos que «no solo de pan vive el hombre».

La **limosna** expresa amor al prójimo, compartiendo lo que tenemos con los necesitados.

La Cuaresma se trata, en última instancia, de amor: amor a Dios expresado en la oración, amor a nosotros mismos expresado en el ayuno que purifica, y amor al prójimo expresado en la generosidad. Mientras caminamos hacia la cruz y la tumba vacía, que estas disciplinas nos ayuden a morir al pecado y resucitar con Cristo en novedad de vida.


