Pentecost

Pentecost is often called the birthday of the Church, but it is more than the beginning of a new institution. It is the moment when fearful disciples became courageous witnesses. The Apostles had already seen the Resurrection. They had already heard the teachings of Christ. And yet they remained behind locked doors. It was only when the Holy Spirit came upon them that they went out into the world. That is an important reminder for us. Knowledge of the faith is not enough. Good intentions are not enough. Even being close to holy things is not enough. We need the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel, Jesus promises that the Spirit will teach, remind, guide, and strengthen His people. The same Spirit given to the Apostles at Pentecost is given to us in Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation. The Holy Spirit is not a distant force or vague inspiration. He is the Third Person of the Trinity dwelling within us, calling us to holiness and mission. Pentecost asks each of us a question: Have we allowed the Holy Spirit to change us? It is possible to remain “behind locked doors” in our own lives—locked by fear, comfort, discouragement, routine, or attachment to sin. The Spirit always pushes outward. He moves us toward prayer, repentance, charity, evangelization, and deeper trust in God. Our parish, too, needs Pentecost. Every ministry, every Mass, every act of service, every effort to hand on the faith will bear fruit only if the Holy Spirit is at work. Programs alone do not renew the Church. The Spirit renews the Church. As we celebrate this great feast, perhaps our prayer can be simple: *Come, Holy Spirit. Set our hearts on fire. Give us courage to live the Gospel faithfully, wisdom to follow Your guidance, and zeal to bring others to Christ.*

A Pentecostés se le llama muchas veces el nacimiento de la Iglesia, pero es más que el comienzo de una nueva institución. Es el momento en que unos discípulos llenos de temor se convirtieron en testigos valientes. Los Apóstoles ya habían visto la Resurrección. Ya habían escuchado las enseñanzas de Cristo. Y aun así permanecían detrás de puertas cerradas. Fue solamente cuando el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre ellos que salieron al mundo. Eso es un recordatorio importante para nosotros. El conocimiento de la fe no es suficiente. Las buenas intenciones no son suficientes. Incluso estar cerca de las cosas santas no es suficiente. Necesitamos al Espíritu Santo. En el Evangelio, Jesús promete que el Espíritu enseñará, recordará, guiará y fortalecerá a su pueblo. El mismo Espíritu dado a los Apóstoles en Pentecostés nos es dado a nosotros en el Bautismo y fortalecido en la Confirmación. El Espíritu Santo no es una fuerza distante ni una inspiración vaga. Él es la Tercera Persona de la Santísima Trinidad que habita en nosotros, llamándonos a la santidad y a la misión. Pentecostés nos hace una pregunta a cada uno de nosotros: ¿Hemos permitido que el Espíritu Santo nos transforme? Es posible permanecer “detrás de puertas cerradas” en nuestra propia vida: cerrados por el miedo, la comodidad, el desánimo, la rutina o el apego al pecado. El Espíritu siempre impulsa hacia afuera. Nos mueve hacia la oración, el arrepentimiento, la caridad, la evangelización y una confianza más profunda en Dios. Nuestra parroquia también necesita Pentecostés. Cada ministerio, cada Misa, cada acto de servicio, cada esfuerzo por transmitir la fe dará fruto solamente si el Espíritu Santo está obrando. Los programas por sí solos no renuevan a la Iglesia. El Espíritu renueva a la Iglesia. Mientras celebramos esta gran fiesta, quizá nuestra oración pueda ser sencilla: *Ven, Espíritu Santo. Enciende nuestros corazones. Danos valentía para vivir el Evangelio con fidelidad, sabiduría para seguir tu guía y celo para llevar a otros a Cristo.*

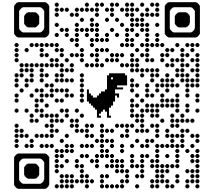
