The Advocate

Today Jesus gives a promise that is both consoling and demanding: “If you love me, you will keep my commandments... and I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always.” Notice the order. Love comes first—but real love is never abstract. It takes shape in obedience. That’s where this Gospel pushes us a bit. It’s easy to say we love Christ; it’s harder to let that love actually govern our choices, especially when His commandments cut against our preferences or the spirit of the age. Jesus isn’t interested in sentimental attachment. He’s forming disciples whose lives reflect His own. At the same time, He doesn’t leave us to manage this on our own strength. He promises “another Advocate,” the Holy Spirit, who remains with us and within us. This is not just poetic language—it’s a concrete reality. The Christian life is not a solo effort of willpower; it is a life lived with God actively at work in us. The Spirit teaches, strengthens, corrects, and consoles. If we feel stuck or spiritually dry, it’s worth asking honestly: am I relying only on myself, or am I truly inviting the Holy Spirit to lead? There’s also a quiet but powerful line: “I will not leave you orphans.” In a world where many feel abandoned or uncertain, Christ assures us that we belong. Through baptism, we are brought into a relationship that is stable and enduring, even when our emotions fluctuate. We are not alone, and we are not left to figure everything out in the dark. So the path forward is clear, even if it isn’t easy: love Christ, keep His commandments, and rely on the Spirit He gives. That’s not a vague spirituality—it’s a concrete way of life. And if we commit to it, we begin to experience what Jesus promises: His own life alive within us.

Hoy Jesús nos hace una promesa que es a la vez consoladora y exigente: «Si me aman guardaren mis mandamientos... y yo rogaré al Padre, y él os dará otro Consolador para que esté siempre con vosotros». Observen el orden. El amor viene primero, pero el amor verdadero nunca es abstracto. Se manifiesta en la obediencia. Ahí es donde este Evangelio nos interpela. Es fácil decir que amamos a Cristo; es más difícil dejar que ese amor guíe nuestras decisiones, especialmente cuando sus mandamientos van en contra de nuestras preferencias o del espíritu de la época. A Jesús no le interesa el apego sentimental. Está formando discípulos cuyas vidas reflejen la suya. Al mismo tiempo, no nos deja solos para que lo logremos por nuestra cuenta. Promete «otro Consolador», el Espíritu Santo, que permanece con nosotros y dentro de nosotros. Esto no es solo lenguaje poético, es una realidad concreta. La vida cristiana no es un esfuerzo solitario de fuerza de voluntad; es una vida vivida con Dios obrando activamente en nosotros. El Espíritu enseña, fortalece, corrige y consuela. Si nos sentimos estancados o espiritualmente secos, vale la pena preguntarnos con sinceridad: ¿Confío solo en mí mismo o realmente invito al Espíritu Santo a guiarme? También hay una frase sencilla pero poderosa: «No los dejaré huérfanos». En un mundo donde muchos se sienten abandonados o inseguros, Cristo nos asegura que pertenecemos a una comunidad. Mediante el bautismo, entramos en una relación estable y duradera, incluso cuando nuestras emociones fluctúan. No estamos solos, ni se nos deja a ciegas para que lo resuelva todo. Así que el camino a seguir es claro, aunque no sea fácil: amar a Cristo, guardar sus mandamientos y confiar en el Espíritu que Él nos da. No se trata de una espiritualidad vaga, sino de una forma de vida concreta. Y si nos comprometemos con ella, comenzamos a experimentar lo que Jesús promete: su propia vida viva en nosotros.

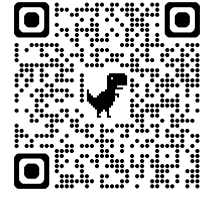
