Trinity Sunday

Trinity Sunday can feel intimidating. We celebrate a mystery that theologians have spent centuries trying to explain and still cannot fully capture: one God in three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is tempting to think that the Trinity is an abstract doctrine meant for scholars. But the Trinity is not a puzzle to solve; it is the deepest truth about who God is and therefore about who we are. In the Gospel for Trinity Sunday, Jesus tells His disciples that the Holy Spirit will guide them into all truth. Notice what this means: God does not remain distant. The Father sends the Son into the world. The Son reveals the Father and gives Himself for us on the Cross. The Holy Spirit is poured into our hearts and remains with the Church. The life of God is a life of self-giving love, and that love reaches out to us. We were made in the image of this God. Human beings are not created for isolation, self-centeredness, or independence. We are made for communion—with God and with one another. Every vocation in the Church reflects this: marriage, priesthood, consecrated life, and the generous Christian life lived in the world. Love always moves outward. Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we profess this mystery: “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” We do it so often that it can become routine. Trinity Sunday invites us to slow down and recognize what we are saying. We begin and end our prayer with the Trinity because the whole Christian life begins in the Father’s love, passes through the saving work of the Son, and is sustained by the grace of the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Trinity will never fit completely within our minds. But it is not meant only to be understood. It is meant to be lived. The more we enter into prayer, receive the sacraments, and learn to love as Christ loves, the more we are drawn into the very life of God. And that is the astonishing truth of this feast: the God who is eternal communion of love invites us to share in His life.

El Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad puede parecer intimidante. Celebramos un misterio sobre el cual los teólogos han reflexionado durante siglos y que aun así no pueden explicar plenamente: un solo Dios en tres Personas: Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. Es fácil pensar que la Trinidad es una doctrina abstracta reservada para los estudiosos. Pero la Trinidad no es un acertijo que debemos resolver; es la verdad más profunda sobre quién es Dios y, por lo tanto, sobre quiénes somos nosotros. En el Evangelio del Domingo de la Trinidad, Jesús dice a sus discípulos que el Espíritu Santo los guiará hacia la verdad plena. Fijémonos en lo que esto significa: Dios no permanece distante. El Padre envía al Hijo al mundo. El Hijo revela al Padre y se entrega por nosotros en la Cruz. El Espíritu Santo es derramado en nuestros corazones y permanece con la Iglesia. La vida de Dios es una vida de amor que se entrega, y ese amor sale a nuestro encuentro. Fuimos creados a imagen de este Dios. El ser humano no fue hecho para el aislamiento, el egoísmo ni la independencia. Fuimos creados para la comunión: con Dios y entre nosotros. Toda vocación en la Iglesia refleja esto: el matrimonio, el sacerdocio, la vida consagrada y la vida cristiana generosamente vivida en el mundo. El amor siempre sale de sí mismo. Cada vez que hacemos la Señal de la Cruz, profesamos este misterio: “En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo.” Lo hacemos tan frecuentemente que puede convertirse en algo rutinario. El Domingo de la Trinidad nos invita a detenernos y reconocer lo que estamos diciendo. Comenzamos y terminamos nuestra oración con la Trinidad porque toda la vida cristiana nace del amor del Padre, pasa por la obra salvadora del Hijo y es sostenida por la gracia del Espíritu Santo. El misterio de la Trinidad nunca podrá ser comprendido completamente por nuestra mente. Pero no está destinado solamente a ser entendido. Está destinado a ser vivido. Cuanto más entramos en la oración, recibimos los sacramentos y aprendemos a amar como Cristo ama, más somos introducidos en la misma vida de Dios. Y esa es la verdad sorprendente de esta solemnidad: el Dios que es comunión eterna de amor nos invita a participar de su propia vida.

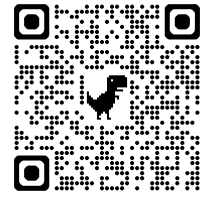
