Key Responsibilities

Program Leadership & Development

- Design, implement, and oversee a comprehensive Fatherhood Program aligned with the center's Christian and pro-life mission.
- Develop curricula and resources for fatherhood education, mentoring, and discipleship.
- Partner with local churches, ministries, and community organizations to expand outreach and recruit male volunteers and mentors for our centers in New Albany, Corydon, and Salem.
- Evaluate program effectiveness and make data-driven improvements.

Client Engagement

- Meet one-on-one with male clients, offering support, guidance, and biblical encouragement.
- Facilitate group sessions on topics such as fatherhood, relationships, faith, and life skills.
- Collaborate with client advocates in all centers to ensure coordinated care for couples and families.

Volunteer Development

- Recruit, train, and equip male mentors and volunteers for client interaction in New Albany, Corydon, and Salem Centers.
- Provide ongoing support and discipleship to maintain a strong team culture rooted in grace and truth.

Community Relations

- Represent the ministry at community events, churches, and partner organizations to raise awareness of the Fatherhood Program.
- Build partnerships with local employers, ministries, and resource networks to assist clients with employment, education, and spiritual growth opportunities.
