1. What's In a Name?

God named sea creatures and stars—and He calls them by name. (Leviathan; four beasts in the River Euphrates; Orion; Pleiades)

2. Bearing Jesus' Name Means You Have Something of _______Value.

Jesus has given us permission to bear His name. Have you really grasped that?

We must pay more attention, therefore, to who we are, lest we sabotage our own witness. We were all sinners, no better or worse than other people, who hated or ignored God. We were all deserving of God's wrath, but God in His mercy sent Jesus to die on the cross for our sins.

We have died with Christ and we are raised with Christ. Our identity to ourselves has died, and now our identity is wrapped up in His life. When some accept Christ God lets them go to Heaven right away – as martyrs. Others of us stay here, because God has a job for us to do, not just to do witnessing, but for us to be His witness.

Who are we? The Bible says we are ambassadors, we are brothers, children, kings, and priests. However other people can be those things too. But distinctly and uniquely, we are called Christians.

3. Bearing His Name Means That You Have Good ______.
