

## ESTHER

Romans 8:28 of the Old Testament. Although Esther does not directly mention God, one cannot deny God's remarkable presence and providence with His people—however invisible He may appear to be at times. The term “Jew” is found here more than in all of the rest of the O.T. combined.

## JOB

The book of **JOB** contains more rare and archaic words than any other book of the Bible. Job is referred to as a perfect man (like we might refer to a “perfect child”)—not sinless. Why read Job? To see a man's unshakable faith in God in the midst of incredible suffering. *Faith is always better than frustration.*

**PSALMS** strikes every note in the chord of human experience. It stands as enduring proof that it's okay to tell God how we feel—as long as we end up praising Him. *“A psalm a day keeps worry away.”*
