

As you continue **EZEKIEL**, God's presence leaves the temple in chapter 10 and returns in chapter 43.

In **DANIEL** the Chaldeans try to change the Jews' thinking, loyalty, lifestyle. **HOSEA** tells of Hosea's love for Gomer (symbolic of God's love for Israel—even though they are unfaithful to Him).

**JOEL** warns that the swarm of locusts is minor compared to what's ahead if the people continue in sin.

**AMOS** is a reminder that sin separates us from God.

**OBADIAH** is the story of payback. Though the people of Edom live in a rock fortress, everybody will see Rock City . . . fall!

**JONAH** is the story of *Prophet Overboard*.

**MICAH** echoes the refrain: There's no God like our God.

**NAHUM** is a reminder that terror will end because God rules; Nineveh falls.

**HABAKKUK** is the O.T. version of "the just shall live by faith."

**ZEPHANIAH** is Good-bye, Human Race. We know so much of God's mercy, we hardly understand His wrath. **HAGGAI** says that God is whom we've been longing for.
