The North Suburban Chicago CROP Hunger Walk steps off on Sunday, October 5, 2025 at 12:00 noon. Our host is North Shore United Methodist Church, 213 Hazel Avenue, Glencoe, IL.



It's time for NCC Walkers to sign up, start fund raising, and invite friends and family to join. The need this year is critical. 25% of funds raised remain in our community. Our local recipients are A Just Harvest, Northfield Township Food Depository, and New Trier Township Food Pantry.

With federal cuts to the SNAP program, more and more children, families, and seniors are turning to these local resources for their daily food. 75% of the money raised goes to Church World Service, the international relief agency that is the parent organization for all CROP Walks. Due to the cuts to USAID, CWS and its partners are the only remaining organizations doing life-saving development work providing food, shelter, transportation, disaster relief, and medical care for our neighbors worldwide living on the edge of survival.
