Looking Over the Pulpit — Duayne Meyer

"As with so many seasons in our lives, we find ourselves sad and grateful at the same time and for the same reasons. Sad, because we have come to the end of a fruitful season which, as we reflect, has brought joy, satisfaction and a deepening of relationships and of faith. The irony is we feel gratitude at the same time as we have feelings of loss; grateful and grieving all at once. In her essay, "The Open Door," Helen Keller wrote, "what we once enjoyed...we can never lose, for all that we love deeply becomes a part of us." Maybe we should call this mixed bag of emotions, "sadtude," a mash-up of sadness and gratitude.

Maybe not but, at the very least, we must lift up with joy and appreciation the 20-year ministry of our Pastoral Associate and friend Ronda Bower. It is deeply gratifying to have shared ministry with her at NCC for these two decades. Ronda is not only a colleague and co-worker, she is a friend and neighbor to Beth and me. And while we will miss her - as all of us at NCC will miss her - we delight with her as she embarks on this next part of her life journey and once again makes her home in Florida near her children and grandchildren.

As for NCC, as with the seasons, we march on. The Search Committee is actively engaged in the interview process and is hopeful to have a candidate to introduce to the Church Council; perhaps as early as the middle or end of August. If the process continues into fall, then the Board of Christian Education and Church Council will need to organize in a way that our Christian Education ministry can effectively continue this ministry that is so vital to NCC's life and health.

Of course, we are also in a season of refreshment of our facilities and ground. Seems like an apropos metaphor, given our search for a new ministry staff person. We are doing a little de-constructing and then will put things back together again. Things will look a little - not a lot - different. There will be a different "vibe" to the place. Surely this is true in many regards.

Even as we are in a season of change, there is a constancy to be counted on, dear sisters and brothers. We can depend on the pleadings of the Holy Spirit. In our busyness and work as an organization, it is critical that we should also be still so we might hear and see - and feel some poking and prodding of - the Holy Spirit at work among us. How and where are we being led as Christ's church? What part are each of us to play? What am I to do as the gospel is proclaimed in and through my church?

Yes, I know it's summer and it will be summer for a little while longer (thank heavens!). But you and I also know it is a changing season in our church. It's a season of gratitude: thank you Ronda Grant Bower for your good and faithful ministry! It is a season of sadness: we will miss you Miss Ronda! And is it a season of change and opportunity: we are excited as we stand on tip-toe to see what the Holy Spirit might yet have in store for Northfield Community Church.
