



MESSAGE FROM FR. COLLINS

Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving and enjoyed time with family and friends. This weekend, we begin the

season of Advent, a beautiful time of hopeful anticipation and preparation of our hearts for Christ. As we light the first candle of the Advent wreath, we reflect on the hope that this new season brings. Advent reminds us that we are a people of promise, called to live in joyful expectation of Jesus, the Light of the World, who illuminates our paths in the ways of His kingdom.

This time of year often brings a cascade of activity: shopping, decorating, planning, and countless commitments. Amid our busy lives, it can be easy to let these weeks pass by unnoticed or to feel overwhelmed by the demands of the season. However, Advent gently invites us to slow down and refocus on what truly matters: Christ, who desires to bring you peace, renew your spirit, and fill you with a hope that never disappoints.

I encourage you to challenge yourself to make this year's Advent season truly fruitful and meaningful. Here are some simple suggestions: Consider creating an Advent wreath for your home, or set aside a few minutes each day to pray together, read a short Scripture passage, or reflect on an Advent devotion, whether as a family or individually. Follow the tradition of lighting the Advent candles each week. Extend the Light of the season by engaging in intentional acts of kindness and charity towards others, especially those who are struggling to find the joy of Christ in their lives. These simple practices can open you to the grace of Advent in a more fruitful and meaningful way.

Finally, I invite you to participate in our parish Advent programs in the coming weeks. We will have special opportunities to encounter God's mercy and love, including extra times for the Sacrament of Confession (Reconciliation) on Mondays from 6:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M., beginning on Monday, December 8, throughout the Advent season. On Wednesday, December 17, we will also hold an Advent Day of Prayer and Adoration. Following the 8 A.M. Mass that day, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar for personal prayer and adoration throughout the day. We will conclude with an Advent reflection and benediction at 7 P.M. Please sign up for an individual prayer time slot at the church's main entrance. I also encourage you to participate in our parish's various charity programs and outreach efforts to assist those in need during this season.

May this Advent season fill your hearts with hope, bless your homes with peace, and renew your lives with the quiet joy that comes from knowing Jesus, who is our hope.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UN-DERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE- First Sunday of Advent Matthew 24:37-44

A few years ago, my house was broken into on Super Bowl Sunday. Turns out, it's a great day for burglars. If the TV isn't on, people are probably watching the game somewhere else, so ... easy pickins'. I'll never forget walking into my bedroom and realizing someone had been there. My stuff was thrown all over the floor. The closet was torn apart. It was disorienting and disturbing — someone had invaded the space I thought was secure. After that, I bought an alarm system. And every Super Bowl Sunday since, I'm extra careful to lock the doors and keep the lights on. That experience made me more alert. Not scared. Just attentive.

That's much like the spiritual place Jesus wants us to be on this first Sunday of Advent. He doesn't start the season with soft candlelight and cozy manger scenes. He starts with two brutal images: a flood and a thief. In other words, chaos and violation. Why? Because life will flood us. Chaos *will* come. And in the midst of it, Christ will come like a thief — not to steal from us, but to steal us back. He is the intruder we should want. The one who breaks in, not to ransack, but to rescue.

Christ presents himself as the thief but also the new Noah. He builds the ark of the Church to carry us through the flood. And he invites us to join him. How? By participating fully in our parishes. By making our homes places of prayer. By guarding our hearts with truth. By refusing to let spiritual complacency leave us exposed. By repentance.

This Advent, don't just stay vaguely "awake." Prepare. Build. Watch. The flood will come. But so will he.

Saint of the week -St Andrew

Saint Andrew was a fisherman in Galilee, along with his brother, Peter, when they were called by Jesus to leave their boat and become fishers of men. John's Gospel also places him



as a follower of John the Baptist before he came to be one of Jesus' twelve Disciples. Beyond the scant references in the Gospels, not much is known of Saint Andrew's life. According to Christian tradition Saint Andrew, like many of his fellow Disciples, went out into Greece and Turkey to preach the Good News. A 4th century account of the saint's life tells of his martyrdom by crucifixion in Patras. Medieval accounts describe the cross used as X-shaped because Andrew said he was not worthy to die on the same style of cross as Jesus.

Famously, Saint Andrew is the patron Saint of Scotland, the country's flag bearing the X-shaped cross associated with him. Legends claim that the saint either traveled to Scotland to spread the Gospel or that his relics were brought there by St. Regulus who had a vision telling him to take the bones to the end of the earth. Regulus set out and was shipwrecked on the coast of Scotland. Today relics of St. Andrew which had been held by the Vatican are now at a shrine in Patras.


