

Saint of the week —St Peter Claver

Saint Peter Claver was a Spanish Jesuit priest (1581-1654) who ministered to enslaved Africans arriving in Cartagena, Colombia, the chief



hub of the transatlantic slave trade. Known as the "Apostle of the Negroes," he dedicated his life to meeting their physical and spiritual needs, providing food, medicine, and comfort to the sick and terrified captives. His work aimed to affirm their human dignity. He died on September 8, 1654.

Who Are the Women of St. Patrick?

The Women of St. Patrick, formerly known as The Ladies Guild, is a parish ministry that unites women of faith for fellowship, Christian service, and support of parish activities through fundraising and volunteering.

What Do They Do?

They organize several events annually, including the Geranium Sale, Mum Sale, Gingerbread Fair, Spring Luncheon, Coffee Hours, and Potluck Suppers. The highlight of their year is the annual Gingerbread Fair, which features handcrafted items, baked goods, and meals at the Gingerbread Café.

Thanks to your generous support, the Women of St. Patrick have made significant contributions to our parish. Here are some of the highlights of our donations:

College Scholarships: Since the first St. Patrick Parish Gingerbread Fair in 2003, the Women of St. Patrick have awarded over forty \$1,000 scholarships to high school seniors in our parish!

Parish Support and Improvements: We have purchased many necessary items for the parish and assisted in funding repairs and renovations, including altar linens, new altar cloths, and vestments, a votive candle stand, contributions towards the repair of the church bells (carillons), restoration, painting, and decorating of the men's and women's bathrooms, equipment for the Parish Hall Kitchen (including commercial dishwasher (with recent repairs), partial payment for a stove, coffee pots and carafes, folding tables and tablecloths, dinnerware (plates, bowls, teaspoons, and more), professional cleaning and sanitizing of the Parish Hall Kitchen, a Power-Point projector and TV screens/monitors for the Faith Formation Program and general parish use, donations to the pastor's annual appeal, funding for the repair, restoration, and ongoing maintenance of the beautiful stone fountain on the parish grounds, purchase of geraniums and chrysanthemums for the church and rectory, contributions towards the Church Grounds Fund to assist with the maintenance of our church grounds, donations towards the General Parish Fund for various repairs and maintenance, books for the Little Free Library (\$300), Celtic rosary beads for blessing bags distributed to the homebound and individuals in nursing homes by the Faith Formation Program.

Charitable Donations: We have also supported various charitable initiatives, including Haiti Ministry, Divine Hope Mission, the Human Needs Family-to-Family Christmas Gift Project & Giving Tree, Burlington Food Bank, and Canton Food Bank, among others.

The Women of St. Patrick not only sponsor various events and fundraisers throughout the year but also support and provide items for other parish events. Thank you for your continued support!

OCIA PROGRAM TO BEGIN!

The OCIA Program (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) will begin on September 25th for any adults who are interested in becoming Catholic or adults who were baptized only.

This interesting and exciting program will instruct candidates in the foundations of the Catholic faith and prepare them to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil, when they will receive the sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation). Meetings are typically held twice per month for 90 minutes and will explore many aspects of the faith in an interactive format.

program from OCIA, is preparing to begin in October.




