Google has released a new interactive doodle, turning a typical backyard BBQ into a baseball game. Players can join in by clicking a button to "swing" at home plate against an outfield of peanuts. The game keeps score automatically, and each round ends with a virtual baseball card featuring one of the food items on the player's team. The doodle is filled with cute details, including rotating baseballs that appear as "loading" bubbles before the game begins. The vintage-looking baseball cards are designed by Matt Cruickshank, an animator and artist from Google's Doodles team. Interestingly, attendance at major league baseball games has been declining for four years in a row, but day-of-game sales have increased by 6%. Maybe this doodle will inspire Americans to head out to the ballpark. Did you know that the first Google Doodle was launched as an "out of office" message when Larry and Sergey went on vacation?
