Introduction

Each Teacher's Guide focuses on one book from Finding My Way books. Discussion, vocabulary, and activities help students expand their capacity to promote inclusion and become an inclusive friend. Inclusive stories provide students the opportunity to meet and then talk about children who may be different, yet also be someone with whom they have things in common.

Discussion Starters and Classroom Activities

#1 Discussion Starter: MyaGrace had to decide what to wear. She didn't just choose the dress she liked. She thought about each dress and determined which one would be best. How did she decide?

Activity: Dances often have themes. Have students think of themes for a school dance. List their ideas on the board. Review the list and ask students' opinion about each idea before voting for the best theme. Discuss their decision-making process.

#2 *Discussion Starter:* MyaGrace took part in all the activities to get ready for the dance. She didn't do them all by herself. Which activities did she do with others? When have you worked with others to prepare for an activity? How did that make you feel?

Activity: Have students sit quietly and listen to a song. Then have students move their desks and dance to a song. Have students share how they felt listening (by themselves) compared to participating by dancing (interacting with others).

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Literacy Activities

Directions: Below are fun activities to do after reading MyaGrace's true story.

MyaGrace is excited about going to the school dance.

- 1. Talk about an activity you've been excited about attending.
- 2. Play a game where you whisper a message to the person next to you and they pass the message on. When everyone has heard the message compare what the last person heard to what was the original message. Have the message be an invitation to a special activity.

MyaGrace makes a list.

- 1. Make a list of lists. What kind of lists do you write? Examples are grocery lists or homework lists.
- 2. Make a list of what your family or class needs to do to get ready for a special activity.

MyaGrace gets ready to go to the school dance.

- 1. Complete the list you made to get ready for your special activity. Have fun!
- 2. Have a family dance. Take turns dancing to each family members favorite music.
