Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God

Why is January 1 special in the Church?

January 1 is a very special day for Christians. It is eight days after Christmas, and in Bible times, babies were given their name on the eighth day after they were born. On this day, Jesus was given His name. On January 1, the Catholic Church celebrates Mary as the Mother of God. This means we honor Mary for saying yes to God and for being the mother of Jesus, who Christians believe is the Son of God.

In the Catholic Church, especially the Roman Rite, January 1 is called the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, which means Catholics are asked to go to Mass if they can.

The Holy Name of Jesus

The month of January is special because it is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus.

The name Jesus is very important and very powerful. The Bible tells us that everyone in heaven and on earth honors His name. God chose the name Jesus before He was born. The angel Gabriel told Mary that her baby would be named Jesus.

The name Jesus means "Savior." This reminds us that Jesus came to save us because He loves us so much. He was willing to give His life for us.

The name of Jesus is the sweetest name. Jesus is our best friend, and He always loves us and cares for us.

When we pray, we pray in Jesus' name, and God listens to us. The Church also uses the name of Jesus when celebrating the sacraments, blessing people and homes, helping the sick, and praying for those who have died.

Jesus is everything to us. When we say His name with love and trust, we remember that He is always with us—now and forever.

January Family challenge

- Start with Baptism: Renew your family's baptismal promises, use holy water, and celebrate Baptism birthdays as a family tradition.
- Pray & Learn Together: Set aside daily prayer time (even 5 mins), learn new prayers (Memorare, St. Michael), or read books by Catholic authors like Fr. Donald Callaway's "33 Days to the Holy Family" for a consecration challenge.
- Celebrate Feast Days: Look up January feasts (Epiphany, Baptism of the Lord, St. Agnes, etc.) and find fun ways to acknowledge them with your kids.
- Attend Mass & Confession: Make attending Mass (maybe even daily if possible) and regular Confession a family goal.
- Focus on Scripture: Use the monthly readings (Epiphany to Baptism of the Lord) as a guide for family discussions on light, hope, and God's love, suggest Young Catholics website.
- "Bring a Friend" to Mass: Encourage bringing another family or friend to Sunday Mass to share the faith.
- Create a Faith Bucket List: Make your own list of goals, like visiting churches, volunteering, or going on a mini-pilgrimage.

These activities aim to bring families closer to God and each other in practical, enjoyable ways, using the new year as a fresh start for spiritual growth.
