



Happy Hallowtide!

Did you know that Halloween began as a Catholic celebration? The word Halloween comes from All Hallow's Eve - the night before All Saints' Day (Nov. 1) — when the Church honors everyone who has reached heaven. The next day, All Souls' Day (Nov. 2), we pray for those who have died and are still being purified on their way to heaven. Together, these three days — All Hallows' Eve, All Saints' Day, and All Souls' Day – are called Hallowtide or the Days of the Dead,

reminding us that life in Christ never ends. Why Catholics Celebrate Hallowtide To remember that we are all called to be saints. To pray for the souls of the faithful departed. To rejoice in God's promise of eternal life.

To thank the saints who inspire us and ask their prayers.

Where Our Traditions Come From

Dressing up - came from French Catholic customs, where children dressed as saints, angels, or biblical figures to honor holy men and women.

Jack-o'-lanterns - came from Irish Catholics, who first carved turnips, lighting them to symbolize souls shining in the darkness. Trick-or-treating - started in England, where people went door-todoor asking for "soul cakes." In return, they promised to pray for the loved ones of the families who gave them treats.

These faith-filled customs came to America through English, Irish, and French Catholic immigrants and blended together into the joyful celebration we now call Halloween.

Join Us for Our All Souls Day Trunk-or-Treat! Let's keep the Catholic spirit of this season alive! Kids are invited to dress up as their favorite saint, hero, or someone they admire.




