
The Knights of Columbus are selling raffle tickets through August and September The tickets can be purchased after all masses and at the Parish office.





September Family Challenges

- Grandparents Day is the first Sunday after Labor Day. Help your children do something special with their grandparents or spend the day with them.
- Decorate wooden, or even paper, letters spelling out MARY. Be as colorful and creative as you want to celebrate the Holy Name of Mary (Sept. 12th).
 - -ON Labor day, Take the time to write a note or give a small gift to someone who works hard for your community (or for your family!).
 - -Jesus is the Bread of Life. Pick out your favorite bread recipe and have your children help you make it.
 - -Be a peacemaker. Do something nice for someone that you sometimes argue with. The feast day of St. Wenceslaus is Sept. 28th.
- -Saints can seem like people from long ago to children. Talk to them about Saint Teresa of Calcutta (when she lived and died), her work, and her writings. Her feast day is September 5th.
 - -Find your favorite cross craft to create on Sept. 14th for the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.
 - -Look around your room, house, or pantry for items or food to donate to the less fortunate. The feast day of St. Vincent de Paul is Sept. 27th.
- -Learn a prayer or even short phrase (like "Ora Pro Nobis," which means "pray for us") in Latin. St. Jerome translated the Bible from Hebrew to Latin, and his feast day is Sept. 30th.

September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows



The month of September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows. When you think of someone suffering, what do you think of? Do you think of someone who is sick, or a person without \ food? These are what we call physical sufferings. Many of the saints suffered physically

before they died. But there is another type of suffering too: spiritual suffering.

Aside from Jesus, no other person has spiritually suffered as much as the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary, called upon by God to bring Jesus into the world, witnessed all of the hurtful things that happened to Jesus. Mary knew that God had sent Jesus here to teach people to avoid sin and to work toward pleasing God. But because so many people rejected Jesus, Mary's immaculate heart grew weary and sad that people were rejecting God.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary
1.Prophecy of Simeon
2.The Flight to Egypt
3.Loss of Jesus in the Temple
4.Mary meets Jesus on Road to Calvary
5.Jesus dies on the cross
6.Mary receives the Body of Jesus
7.Jesus is placed in the Tomb



To this day, we continue to witness many things that add more pain to Mary's immaculate heart. We are all sinners and in God's eye, a sin is a sin no matter what the sin may be. Even if we think a certain type of sin might not be "as bad" as another sin, all sins are displeasing to God and cause Mary's heart to weep for us today. Mary only wants us to grow closer to Jesus. We can do this by asking her to pray for us that, by the grace of God, we might be able to overcome our own temptations

Holy Mary, may we follow your example, and stand by all your children who need comfort and love.


Mother of God, stand by us in our trials and care for us in our many needs. Pray for us now and at the hour of our death.
