



July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Christ

July is the month dedicated to the Precious Blood of our Lord. The feast celebrating the Precious Blood was introduced by Pope Pius IX in 1849, but devotion to it goes back to the early days of Christianity. The early Church Fathers taught that the Church was born from Christ's pierced side, and that the sacraments came from His Blood. The Precious Blood we honor is what our Savior shed on Calvary and what He took back at His glorious Resurrection. It is the Blood that flows through the body of the risen and glorified Christ, who is now at the right hand of God the Father in heaven. This Blood becomes present on our altars during the Consecration. It is the Blood that has given us grace, cleanses our souls, and starts our journey to eternal life.



A Time of Regeneration

The blood of Christ is part of His Sacred Humanity, thanks to Mary, whose parents, St. Joachim and St. Anne, we remember this month (July 26). Christ's blood shed on the Cross brought us salvation, cleansed the martyrs, and created the Church as it flowed from His wounded side. The Precious Blood of Christ now flows through His Mystical Body and continues His saving work. It preserves, purifies, repairs, and nourishes the members of the Church.

July brings longer, warmer days, which give us a chance to refresh ourselves, both inside and out. As we relax our schedules and feel less pressure, many people travel. Whether we travel or not, we can share the message of Christ with others through our actions, words, and even our clothing. Let us be modest in all we do, like St. Maria Goretti, the young martyr for purity (July 6), and let our lives reflect Christ to everyone we meet.

The summer Mass and Liturgy of the Hours readings remind us that our life on earth is a journey toward being united with Christ, who is the Beginning and the End of this journey. Each Sunday, with its Easter renewal, is a milestone, connecting where we have been to where we are going. May the Precious Blood of Jesus support us as we make our way to our true home, alongside Mary and the angels.

Prayer: Lord of all nations, You are the true King of all Kings and the Lord of all Lords. I choose You as my King and my God. As You come to govern my life, please use me to help establish peace and justice within our society, respecting the rights and dignity of all people, and enacting Your holy will in everything we do. May Your Kingdom come and Your will be done, now and until the end of time. Jesus, I trust in You.
